
THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

12TH JUNE 2022

Gospel: John 16: 12-15

Everything the Father has is mine; all the Spirit tells you will be taken from what is mine.

We hear much today about self-identification. We are told to self-identify. The problem with self-identification is the self. It's so full of it. From a Christian perspective that same self is disintegrated so that any identification which the unreformed self may volunteer about the world, not least about itself is distorted. As society moves away from its biblical foundations, we will find it increasingly difficult to have the objectivity which enables us to make rational opinions about our place in the world and who we are. Catholic teaching insists that our dignity, as human beings, comes from our being made in God's image. Only with reference to God and in relationship to Him... 'in his light do we see light'..;... are we able to identify ourselves as we are, and see others



as they are. Our Christian faith is built on God's self-revelation to us...through His Word and His Spirit. Therefore the only one who can validly self-identify Is God, and this we know from his own revelation of himself. In the book of Exodus when Moses asks God for his name, God gives him the ultimate self-identification. 'I am who I am'. As the revelation of God unfolds we discover more about God's self-identification. Jesus shows us that God is Father, Son and Spirit from eternity....three persons in one, one and one in three....the Tri-unity, which we celebrate today. The three persons have a dynamic relationship of giving and loving, which finds expression in creation and creating. This is where we come in. We discover our true nature and identity in knowing that we are loved by the three 'persons' of the Trinity, and that in return we can freely love and give ourselves to them. In this way we are drawn into the dynamic life of heaven in a most intimate way. Jesus says that if anyone keeps his commandments then 'we will love him and make our home within him'. The only one who can receive this love is the one who believes, welcomes and follows faithfully. This weekend we are welcoming into full communion those who shall be confirmed. They shall be confirming their baptism in the name of the Father, Son and Spirit and pledging their desire to enter more deeply into the dynamic, superabundant life that God wants for them, and to discover their true dignity as the children of God. We hope that the Holy Spirit will find that he is a welcomed guest.
