Gospel: Luke 10: 25-37 Who is my neighbour?

Today's gospel is the story of the Good Samaritan. We call him good but not all Samaritans might have acted as he did. He responded to need and fulfilled the law of love when others who should have acted differently, did not. This however is not the gist of the parable. It is less about the goodness of the deed than that one thought incapable of goodness was the instrument of goodness. There was a deep-seated hatred between Samaritans and the Jews because the Jews considered the Samaritans to be a mongrel race who were also morally and religiously suspect. In the natural progression of the parable, Jesus builds up



the expectation that where the establishment figures of the priest and levite had failed, the ordinary Jewish layman would act differently. But Jesus, instead of picking a moral exemplar from among the Jewish laity, picks a person whom all Jews were encouraged to hate or distrust. If we thought that this was simply a Jewish problem of racial stereotyping then we have missed the point of the parable. The parable uncovers our deception: that we too readily assume that we (and those most like us) would act righteously, but that those who are most unlike us (or with whom we may have a problem) are incapable of doing so. Why do we make such assumptions? Why do we see others without the eyes and compassion of Christ? Where does our judgementalism come from? Are we projecting onto others our hang-ups and unconsciously seeking to defend ourselves in hitting out so mercilessly against others? People of religious and denominational faith are not immune from these prejudices. We can be very blinkered, even blind in the way we see others. These prejudices might arise from the cultural and environmental conditioning of our faith and the ways in which we formulate our world view. They may have little to do with the faith itself and may even go to undermining it or contradicting it. We forget that all our presuppositions are brought into judgement by the critical light of divine truth and the cancel culture of the Cross. If we are going to love our neighbour as ourselves then first have to surrender ourselves and lay down the weapons of our warfare. Make me a channel of Your Peace!
