# SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 24<sup>TH</sup> JULY 2022

Gospel: *Luke* 11: 1-13

Ask, and it will be given to you.

The mercy of God is most clearly seen through the saving work of Jesus Christ. In the Old Testament mercy was offered primarily, though not exclusively, through the sacrificial system, but now in Jesus Christ, God provides the one eternal sacrifice who willingly takes on himself the punishment for sin that would otherwise fall on us. It wasn't that God was punishing Jesus for something that he had done, but that out of his love for his Father and for us, Jesus of his own free will underwent the punishment for us. This is why in his human nature Jesus had to learn his Father's will and why he faced such a battle in Gethsemane. The judgement which

should have fallen on us, falls instead on him. This being so, why does Jesus talk so often of a Judgement Day and the consequences of rejecting God? Jesus emphasises more than any Old Testament figure, the reality of God's wrath and the hell that awaits the unrepentant sinner. St James proclaims that mercy triumphs over judgement, but that doesn't sidestep judgment, for as the apostle goes on to say, judgement will show no mercy to those who show no mercy. The question posed by Abraham today is what mercy is there in the face of judgement? God replies that the just will not suffer in the same way as the unjust. So where does that leave the many people who die as a result of what are called acts of God? Jesus tells us that God knows when his creatures die, so is God not implicated in the disasters of the world? While it may satisfy insurance companies to call natural disasters acts of God, science tells us that they are very often acts of man. Take for example the effects of climate change. Is it not the greed of humanity which has caused the climatic and ecological equilibrium of the planet which poses such a threat to our existence? Is it not our greed which condemns so many people in our world to poverty and disease? Judgement falls and the vehicle for that judgement is very often the effects of our sin upon the environment. Yet the natural disasters which befall humanity often fall indiscriminately. Environmental degradation hits the poorest, and can we say that the just escape earthquakes, tsunamis and typhoons? When Lisbon was destroyed on All Saints Day in 1755 by three earthquakes many people died because they were in church. At best we can say that such disasters draw us closer to God and to remind us that the destruction of the body is as nothing compared to the destruction of the soul. Perhaps the issue at Sodom was not whether God could have averted the disaster but whether its inhabitants could have. We might say that its destruction was an act of God both because God willed it but also because the creative processes of a sulphuric explosion executed its natural judgement. God acts also to restore a broken world. Are not corporeal acts of mercy in the face of disaster acts of God? Catholic tradition recognises also spiritual acts of mercy, and the first of these is to admonish the sinner. The Divine Mercy offered through Jesus Christ alone averts a second judgement and a second death. On Judgement Day, our Lord says that Capernaum will fare worse than Sodom, because Capernaum had had more opportunity to repent. How will Hoddesdon fare? Ask and it will be given to you. Fr Julian

Cardinal Vincent and the Auxiliary Bishops. The theme of the Pilgrimage is 'Mary Mother of Sorrows, Mother of Joy'. For our troubled world in a year of turmoil, confusion, and the continued war in Ukraine, we bring our prayers and intentions to Our Lady of Walsingham. The coach will leave the church at 8am, to get to Walsingham in good time for 12 noon Mass. After lunch we walk the Holy Mile and conclude with Benediction at the old Priory shrine. We have a 49-seater coach, with a toilet.
