Year C THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY 14TH AUG 2022

Gospel: Luke 1: 39-56

The Almighty has done great things for me, he has exalted the lowly.

Today's epistle reading is from the Apocalypse, the last book of the bible. The Ark of the Covenant was synonymous with God's presence. Its loss must have been a terrible blow to the Jewish people. It was as if God had deserted them. Imagine then St John's surprise as he sees the sanctuary of heaven opened and the ark of the covenant within. On earth the ark may have been lost, but in heaven it was always present, revealing God's eternal desire to live with his people. What is even more remarkable was that St John sees that God has prepared a new ark for his presence on earth. Immediately after the vision of the heavenly ark, St John sees 'a great sign..... in heaven: a woman adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown. She was pregnant, and in labour, crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth'. This passage is an embarrassment to those who wish to deny Mary a rol e in the heavenly economy. They say that this is not a reference to her but a reference to the Church of the Old and New. The allusion to both of these is not excluded ...the twelve stars can represent either the twelve sons of Jacob or the twelve apostles.....but the evidence that this is Mary is irrefutable. Holy scripture is the best interpreter of scripture, and each biblical book best interprets itself. So how does the Apocalypse interpret itself? We are told that the



child, to whom the woman is giving birth, will 'rule all nations with an iron sceptre'. In chapter 19 this is exactly the same description of Jesus, the Word of God, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, who will rule the nations with 'an iron sceptre'. Further, to rule the nations with an iron sceptre is actually one of the messianic prophecies of psalm 2. It is the ark of Mary that God's presence overshadows. The covenantal implications of this are profound if we remember that the ark symbolised God's covenantal relationship with his people. Mary becomes synonymous with people of God, a theme later up in the same passage where Satan wages war against the rest of her children. Other allusions to Mary as the Ark will be found in St Luke's gospel in his accounts of the Annunciation and Visitation, the second of which is our gospel reading today. Thus, already in the early church, and its writings, we have the foundations for the veneration of Mary and the doctrines about her. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption. The Apocalypse shows that Mary is uniquely positioned within the divine economy even before the birth of Christ. It is inconceivable that this was not the case after her earthly life came to an end. The Transfiguration shows that Moses and Elijah are alive, having been assumed into heaven after the end of their mortal lives...the one after physical death, the other without it. How much more one who is far greater in God's purposes and uniquely clothed with universal and stellar implications. Assumed into heaven, she awaits the assumption of all her children. Fr Julian

have the chance to go on pilgrimage to Walsingham with Cardinal Vincent and the Auxiliary Bishops. The




theme of the Pilgrimage is 'Mary Mother of Sorrows, Mother of Joy'. For our troubled world in a year of turmoil, confusion, and the continued war in Ukraine, we bring our prayers and intentions to Our Lady of Walsingham. The coach will leave the church at 8am, to get to Walsingham in good time for 12 noon Mass. After lunch we walk the Holy Mile and conclude with Benediction at the old Priory shrine. We have a 49-seater coach, with a toilet. There are now only 22 spaces left on the coach. To book a place on the coach, fill in the slip at the bottom of the newsletter and give it in with the £28 (£23 coach + £5 pilgrims' levy) cost, either as cash or a cheque payable to 'St Augustine's Catholic Church,' to The Presbytery.
