Gospel: Luke 13: 22-30

Men from east and west will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.

If we think of a company then the Church is the greatest of all, and literally so, for the word company means those who break bread (com-pane) together, exactly the phrase which is used of the early Christians. The difference of course is that the company of the Church exists to glorify God not to self-perpetuate ourselves by whatever dubious means. The Church doesn't just benefit its share-holders. We, the shareholders are the Church. We don't just have a stake in it or share in the comp any of the Church, as one might have shares in a company. In fact, the company of the Church has no life without its shareholders. There is no Church without its people. All form one body, and not one is inessential. If one is diminished all are diminished. If one is magnified, all are magnified. Many companies are multinational, but the Church



is the greatest multinational of all. It is also thoroughly multi-racial and multi-lingual. In the Apocalypse, St John hears the praise of Jesus because he has 'purchased men for God from every tribe and language and people and nation'. Later he sees a 'great multitude in white robes, that no-one could count, from every nation, tribe'. With whom do we populate our vision of heaven? People only like ourselves...the same colour, race, language, gender? Might we have an identity problem? We sometimes have. On occasions Christians have been so racially or nationally prejudiced as to contradict the very mission that we have been entrusted with. When I have visited business schools I have always been struck by how the world of commerce has highjacked the mission language of the Church. All have their mission statements. What is ours? The Church's mission statement is the same as it has always been to go out into the whole world to baptise people in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and to teach them what Jesus has commanded. That mission is universal, and its authentic proclamation and reception breaks down all human walls of selfdefence and stereo-typing. God so loved the whole kosmos... (not just those like us)... that he sent His only begotten Son. This is reinforced today by the voice of the prophet Isaiah: the Lord says this: Tam coming to gather the nations of every language'. Pentecost, the birthday of the Church, has inaugurated the ingathering of the nations. Racial, linguistic, national barriers fall as they give way to pentecostal grace. Our mission isn't just to the city but as apostolic decrees proclaim...urbi et orbi. To the city and to the whole world! In our gospel reading today, Jesus says that people 'from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places in the feast in the kingdom of God'. For some today our society is uncomfortably multi-ethnic and multi-racial. That society is not to be equated with the kingdom of God and its values often run counter to the gospel, yet in its ethnic and racial diversity it presents something of what the kingdom of Fr Julian God will eventually look, more so than anything which has gone before.


