Gospel: Luke 12: 32-48 You too must stand ready.

When I was a child I loved astronomy, and I have never lost the fascination of looking up at the night sky. The James Webb Telescope has revealed things to us previously unseen to the naked eye. Perhaps what is even more remarkable is that we are gazing at things, which though seemingly present to us, are actually in the past. What we see is many light years away, the light having travelled many millions or

billions of years to reach us, so we are seeing galaxies as they were millions or billions of years ago. Abraham was told that his descendants would be like the stars of heaven. Abraham of course didn't have a telescope to look into the night sky, but he did have faith. Faith is a bit like a telescope in that it enables us to make claims about the present and the future on the basis of past truth. Abraham looked back to the promises made by God to him and through faith trusted in those promises and the God who had made them. Faith has this dual purpose of looking forward but always from the springboard of what has been. It is never blind but always enlightened. God has spoken. The light has pierced the darkness. This is why the Letter to the Hebrews talks at length about the characters of the past who through faith were able to look forward to the fulfilment of God's promises made to their ancestors and to 'see' by faith the realisation of the ancient prophecies in the revealing of the Messiah and God's kingdom. Today's epistle from Hebrews says, 'only faith can guarantee the blessings that we hope for, or prove the existence of the realities that at present remain unseen'. We don't normally think of faith as the guarantor of blessing or the proof of reality, but we might understand how, if we like our faith to the James Webb telescope. The scope is universal. The picture glorious. The revelation unmistakable. We don't necessarily understand all that we see. We may stare in wonder. There are more amazing things to be uncovered, but the telescope does not lie. It reveals by light the truth of the past working in the present so that we can with confidence by faith have assurance for the future. The guarantee of the blessings that we hope for, and the proof of the realities that at present remain unseen..... What blessings are you hoping for, and what unseen realities would you like proof of? We should learn from our father Abraham. The realisation of those blessings and of those realities always comes when we and they are grounded in faith in the Light of the World. Fr Julian

have the chance to go on pilgrimage to Walsingham with Cardinal Vincent and the Auxiliary Bishops. The




