Gospel: *Luke* 17: 5-10

If only you had faith!


We cannot have failed to notice that the already unsure economic climate has got a lot more variable, overcast and even tempestuous as a result of the recent governmental budget. Some of the changes have hit the poorer sections of society adversely. Does this have any bearing upon our faith? The prophets leave us in no doubt that it does. The socio-economic and political landscape in which we exercise our faith is not irrelevant to our faith. We don't live in a personal vacuum or a holy bubble and faith always has a social dimension as it works

itself out in relationship to those around us and the condition in which live. Faith is a work out, and its outworking doesn't take place in the gym of self-gratification but in the market place of life. It is very easy for the Christians to lapse into the heresy of thinking that God is concerned only about what we call the sacred and not about the secular. Did God not make the whole kosmos, into which he sent his Son for its redemption? Are not all things...ves, all things... made through Him, for Him and in Him? Is the shepherd just concerned about the flock or not also about the sheep outside the pen? Ever since Mary gave her fiat leading to the birth of the Saviour, the kingdom of God has been breaking through into the world of frail flesh and secular affairs. At the same time the Spirit has been drawing the Church to immerse itself more deeply in that world, from which it is not separate but set apart. We are saved not only from our sins but also for a purpose...the glory of God in whatever walk of life we undertake. Our worship is reserved not just for the holy place but to be expressed at all times and in all places. Here the word liturgy helps. It has come to mean simply the ritual worship of the Church. Understanding its roots gives us a richer understanding of what worship is all about, a worship that is fully fleshed out in our lives. The original word leitourgia stems from two Greek words...litos ergos..which means 'work for the people'. It was the word which was used in ancient Greece to describe the public service which the richer sort had to expend on behalf of others if they were to exercise the benefits of their position. It was like an unofficial tax for the commonweal. Applying this to the more modern understanding of liturgy, thus true worship is always for the benefit of others as well as ourselves. The holy mass of Jesus Christ is offered for the sins of the whole world, just as Jesus died beyond the camp, for the unrighteous as well as the righteous, the holy as well as the unholy. From the mass we are sent out into the world to continue to offer our lives and work as an acceptable sacrifice of worship to God. True liturgy is not just about what we offer in four walls but in the public arena. From the vantage point of faith all ground is sacred, and all economics, and indeed governmental policy, open to the scrutiny of divine leitourgia. Fr Julian Davies
