Gospel: *Luke* 15: 1-10

There will be rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner.

8th September may mark various events in the lives of various people in the world. In the Catholic church, it is the memorial of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. However, for the millions of Catholics, non-Catholics, people of other faiths and none across the globe, 8th September, 2022 will be memorable for many years to come because on this day, Queen Elizabeth II, the longest reigning monarch of Great Britain and Head of the Commonwealth breathed her last. The mood of the nation is overwhelmingly sombre while the outpouring of affection and expression of condolences from the four corners of the world can only be construed as a reflection of the extraordinary life of an extraordinary woman. In many ways Her Majesty wrote a stellar piece by her life and in death, our mourning and sense of loss merely retell the story. As we condole with the royal family for their loss and



wish King Charles III, to whom the baton of leadership and rule has been seamlessly handed over in this most ancient institution, every grace and blessing for a successful reign, we must not fail to seize the opportunity to reflect on our own lives as individuals and a society.

Our Gospel reading for the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Luke 15: 1-32) offers us a splendid occasion for such a reflection. The scenario: Jesus telling a set of three parables of the lost-but-found to publicans and sinners who had come to listen to him in the full glare of the auditorium of the judging Pharisees and Scribes. The first and rather poignant truth of all three parables (of the lost coin, lost sheep and so-called prodigal son) is that God cares for all, especially the lost, those who feel they have failed and those who have fallen



short of the standards. The point is not that God condones with sin or moral waywardness as it is that He loves us despite our failures and will do everything to save us. All we have to do is to cooperate with His grace. The second is how God deals lovingly with apparent justified-anger. He doesn't dismiss the concerns of even the self-righteous but, addresses them in order to fix the dysfunctions of sin and scapegoatism within the human family. A good life, lived in imitation of God is one which seeks to both overcome sin and avoids pointing the accusing finger. This is the mirror of selfreflection that God offers today. us all Fr Michael Quaicoe.
