Gospel: Luke 16: 1-13

You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.

In our Gospel reading today, Jesus addresses the so-called parable of the dishonest administrator and a series of related admonitions to his disciples. The said steward was accused of wasting his master's resources. Aware of the inevitability of rendering account to his master, he applies himself rather astutely. It is this and not his dishonesty that Jesus praises in the parable. He appears to see the unique way out of his troubles. This was informed by assessing as objectively as possible the reality of his situation. He knew he couldn't beg or dig and therefore, he



employed the most useful way out: making friends with his master's debtors in order that in the event of having been made redundant he could make a livelihood from these connections. The point here is that riches or the possession of them are not dishonest in themselves. The question is on how they are acquired or used. Jesus uses this parable to teach us the valuable lesson about discovering the unique path to salvation: God. It is God and not wealth which presents us with the only means and hope of salvation. The truth is that freedom does not mean the liberty to do whatever we like. It is rather the space to choose what is right, because in the end everyone is responsible to or for somebody or something which determines the direction of our lives. If one's life is consumed by the acquisition of wealth, then wealth becomes their master, determining what they desire and what the most important things in life are. However, if one's master is God, then God becomes the dominant principle and interpretive key of life showing the way to true happiness here on earth and assuring them of eternal bliss in the life hereafter. Every human being ought to make the choice of who or what is the dominant and determining principle in their life: God or wealth, since it cannot be both simultaneously. God as master teaches us to deal with wealth responsibly and maturely, but wealth cannot in itself teach us how to relate responsibly to God.



# SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST MATTHEW, Apostle & Evangelist.
21" September

Matthew the Apostle, also called Levi, was sitting at his taxcollector's desk in Capernaum when he was called by Christ.



He followed Him at once, and also gave a feast for Him and the other disciples. After the resurrection of Christ, while Matthew was still in Judaea before going to the district which it had fallen to his lot to evangelize, he wrote the Gospel of Jesus Christ in Hebrew for the sake of the Jews who had become believers. Then he went — tradition says — to Ethiopia and preached the Gospel, confirming his teaching with many miracles. St Matthew's apostolic work was crowned with the glory of martyrdom. His body was taken to Salerno, and later, under Pope Gregory VII, it was transferred to the church there dedicated to St. Matthew.
