

Gospel: Luke 14: 25-33

None of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.

In his war of aggression against Ukraine President Putin seriously underestimated the opposition that he would encounter. Although he has mustered many forces, little real military headway has taken place. In Pakistan we have seen an invasion of a different kind, as the torrents of water have taken many lives, destroyed communities and washed buildings away like cards. Although this disaster could not have been averted, its magnitude is all the greater because of poor infrastructures, often built too close to rivers. Going to war and how we build are features of the two parables



in our gospel reading today. In the case of the one, Jesus talks of a king who seriously underestimated the might of his opponent. In the other, a builder whose tower was non-existent because although he laid a foundation he found that he hadn't considered the true cost of the structure. In both cases there was insufficient long-term planning and a disregard for the outlay. While this has obvious life application, Jesus calls us to consider its implication for discipleship. God calls us to participate in his grand designs, but we will never participate in those designs unless we weigh up what following Jesus entails and its cost. And it is a question of following him, and not just of vaguely believing in God. Even the devil believes in God, as St James reminds us, so there is nothing extraordinary in that. Following Jesus is not about some moral inclination or inducing a comfort fix in self-absorption when we feel like it. If we allow him, he induces a fundamental change in our self-orientation and our awareness of reality and truth. He is being honest in telling us that being a Christian is costly. Everything not least our human relationships has to be prioritised accordingly. Lumen Gentium described the family as the domestic Church, as indeed it is, whenever faith is seeded and nurtured. Increasingly it is also a battle ground where the values for or against God are fought out. We are called to be faithful, witnessing resiliently and lovingly to the truth of the gospel in the face of opposition, rebellion and defection. I say lovingly because no one can be forced to faith, not least our family members. Love is long suffering and patient, whether at home or in the streets. After all our parables today assume long-term development and progression. Wars are neither fought nor buildings built in a day. But if Jesus asks us to hate those nearest and dearest to us, why should we love at all? When we consider that he is calling us to hate even our own life, hatred here is not a vice but a virtue. It is the virtue of seeing everything through the eyes of transcendence. Are we trans in a Christian sense? Are we transitioning to see a world transcended where everything loses its pre-eminence, permanence, and possessiveness including our own hold on life and body, where only the truly eminent and permanent lays claim to us? Faced by those claims, I have only obligations.....obligations to love family and neighbour, and above all our obligation to God and take up my cross and to ruthlessly follow the one who loves us and gave his life for us.
