

# Year C TWENTY NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 16TH OCT 2022

Gospel: Luke 18: 1-8

God will see justice done to his chosen who cry to him.

In today's gospel, Jesus asks the question whether on his return he will find any faith on earth.... faith in the sovereign power of God, revealed in himself and accompanied by persistent and ardent prayer. This faith is closely related also to our yearning for justice, as both are directed towards God, the fount of all



justice and righteousness. Jesus tells the story of a widow who seeks justice from a judge who is not interested in giving it. Eventually because of her persistence the judge concedes and grants the woman's request and gives her the justice she craves. God is not like that, Jesus says. He will 'see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night, even when it may not seem forthcoming and that this will be 'done speedily'. As Jesus' audience listened to this parable, they would have been struck by the woman's victory as she was a widow. Widows were the most vulnerable in society, and without rights. Yet in this case the widow gets her justice., 'her just rights' as Jesus says. It provokes us to ask what are just rights in our world today? We can all think of situations of injustice in our world, where much persistent prayer has gone up by and on behalf of those who have suffered it. We witness today the plight of the impoverished in our world, often caught in the crossfire of internal wars or pawns in the surrogate wars of others. What of the millions affected by climate change caused by the unsustainability of our selfish lifestyles? Do they not have 'just rights' like the widow in the parable? The Church tells us that when we seek to help the needy we exercise the theological virtue of charity and when we seek to change the situation which causes that need, we exercise the cardinal virtue of justice. To the mind set which tries to keep God out of the public space, faith worked out in charity is generally inoffensive, but faith worked out in justice is seen as a threat to vested interests. 'When I give food to the poor they call me a saint. When I ask why the poor have no food they call me a communist', said Helder Camara, former Archbishop of Recife in Brazil. We cannot be people of prayerful faith if we have our eyes closed to the needs of those around us or fail to ask uncomfortable questions, which rattle those with vested interests. Let us earnestly pray for the coming of God's kingdom of justice and righteousness. After all our Mother in the faith has revealed the trajectory of history and made the declaration of 'just rights'. 'He has exalted the humble and meek and filled the hungry with good things'. Fr Julian
