Gospel: Luke 19: 1-10

The Son of Man has come to seek out and save what was lost.

Of the house blessings which I have done, it is the first which most sticks in my mind. It was in my first curacy in Nottinghamshire. A couple had got in touch. They didn't feel any great sense of unease in their home but they wanted it blessed. That they sought a blessing in the first place suggested that they had some faith but I wanted to explore matters with them more deeply since our beliefs always impact upon our sense of domestic ease. When the day of blessing came, I duly sprinkled each room with holy water, accompanied by

the parents and their four-year-old son. As we gathered in the last room, the little one, who up to that time had not said a word, shouted out...'I can smell flowers everywhere!' There wasn't a flower in the house, nor any garden on the housing estate. We adults didn't smell a thing but I took this as confirmation that God had cleansed and blessed their inhabited space. Christians from the early times have asked God to bless where they live. Opening our homes to Him may make us feel vulnerable as there may be things which we may need to get rid of, which at the best may hinder our wholistic well-being or at worst bring a curse rather than a blessing. We may need to ask ourselves, do we hold any space where God is not welcome, or anything which we would rather God not see? God sees everything and He is present everywhere, yet He is more present in some places than others. He is eager to be welcomed. 'Hurry, because I must be at your house today.' Jesus says these words to Zacchaeus with the urgency of a landlord visiting his tenanted property. That probably is the best way to look at the places where we live. Our homes, if we are fortunate to have a roof over our heads, as everything else, is held on trust. What is true of our homes, is even more true of our ensouled bodies. Jesus wants entry and he is not content to be a casual visitor. The very fact that he wants to know us intimately, is a sign of how much he loves us. To recognise that love, is to recognise his deep desire to inhabit. If we love him, he tells us then he will come to us and dwell within us. And what he says of himself, he says also of the Father and the Spirit....'we will come to (you) and make our home with (you)'. Our bodies are temples, but they are also palaces, even if in need of some divine restoration and renovation. 'Lord I am not worthy that you should come under my roof but only say the word and I shall be healed'. We say these words just before we receive the sacrament. They are taken from the gospel passage where the centurion seeks healing for his servant. They could equally have been said by Zacchaeus. Despised as an outcast and stigmatised as socially dis-eased, he found salvation in his wholehearted response to Jesus' request to enter his life. Not only did he throw a party to welcome the Saviour but he made amends by an incredible act of self-abandoned generosity and grace. Zacchaeus blessed Jesus and what a blessing he received in return. And us? Fr Iulian
