Gospel: Luke 17: 11-19

No one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.

I grew up in the Welsh Borders. I wasn't very conscious of a border existing between England and Wales. You tended to have a cross-border mindset. In today's gospel, we find Jesus walking along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he goes, he encounters ten lepers, one of whom is a Samaritan. Wherever it afflicts, leprosy is a great leveller of borders, as is all illness, including our final illness. Samaritans would not normally be found among Jews and vice versa, but

in this case the similarity of their affliction outweighed any racial prejudice. The gospel encourages us to have a cross-border mindset. It always challenges us to step out in faith beyond the narrow circumferences of our associations and vision. When told to wash in the waters of the Jordan, Naaman the Syrian reacted fiercely against the prospect of crossing the border. To do so was tantamount to acknowledging that there was greater truth the other side. Naaman is not alone. Pride gets in the way. We have all tried to resist and to barter our way into the kingdom of heaven, standing on the insecure ground of our own understanding. We may try to defend and self-justify ourselves by saying that we've never harmed anyone, we keep out of the way, we lead a moral life, while ignoring Christ's call to surrender the territorialism of our self-congratulation and embrace the empire of his self-less love. Naaman had to leave his comfort zone, otherwise he would frustrate the healing for which he longed and block the even greater healing on offer.....his salvation...for he returns not just healed of his sickness but as one saved, acknowledging no other 'God except the Lord.' It's the same with us. We become blockages to God's gracious activity as we turn inwards on ourselves. To cross the border from self-independence into God-dependence is to enter into the catholicity of being a universal citizen. It means that the whole world is an open landscape and that like St Paul we carry the good news wherever we go. Christians know that we belong to a universal family of like-minded brothers and sisters, even if we are disunited. St Augustine reminds us that we have everything to do with each other, for we are on one in our belief in Christ. The danger of building up territorial barricades rather than encouraging open borders is a perennial problem for us all. Among those who are not Christians we are also called to build bridges, to exercise the ministry of reconciliation reaching out to those who are not in our camp, to share the good news that Jesus Christ is alive, good news not just for those who are in, but for those who are also out. There may even be border crossings that we can make today.... and always giving thanks to the one who opens the gate and carries us over.
