

Gospel: Luke 22: 35-43 Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom.

Exploring parallel universes may have benefits for the real world, as long as we keep our feet on the ground and remember that the metaverse is not our first home. Critics would say that this is an indulgent form of escapism and a new opiate of the masses, replacing the role that organised religion once filled. Yet there is still a deep yearning for spiritual reality and the desire to find an overarching theory of everything to explain the wonder of life. Physics suggests it can be



found somewhere in the relationship between the theory of relativity and the theory of quantum mechanics, though black holes present a bit of a problem in explanations of everything as they are unlike everything else. It is beyond the scope of science to explain why everything exists, but it may describe it. Long before interplanetary exploration or the discovery of quarks, the Holy Spirit speaking through St Paul presented us with the greatest revelation of everything that exists, not a just theory that satisfies our intellectual curiosities but the very substance of truth which feeds the totality of our desires. It is the one described in our reading today as the Beginning of everything, the real big bang. Jesus is the image of the unseen God and in him all things were created, both visible and invisible. All entities were created through him and for him. From eternity he has existed and in him everything finds its source and meaning. He alone can bring things into unity and hold them together. That means that everything which seems disjointed, everything which at this point in time may not be aligned will be aligned and brought into unity. All things whether we see them as earthly or heavenly will find their reconciliation in him-everything without exception. At the heart of this amazing perspective is a seeming contradiction- a black hole.... the eternal blood-stained cross of Christ which draws all to itself. Such is the gravitational pull of the cross that it gives us access into its own metaverse...the Kingdom of God where a world that patently lacks reconciliation is reconciled and lives so often at odds with others healed through the forgiveness of our sins. In this metaverse we are free. It is unlike the metaverse which we currently know, for it is not computer generated. It is the universe transformed through the meta of metanoia, the grace of conversion, of receiving God's forgiveness as we bring our lives into obedience to Him. Today we celebrate Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe and the Author of Meta. Bend the knee Mark Zuckerberg and the rest of us. Fr Julian
