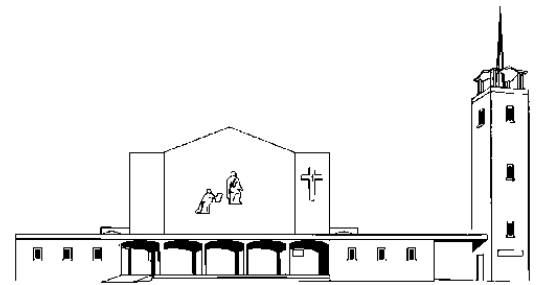

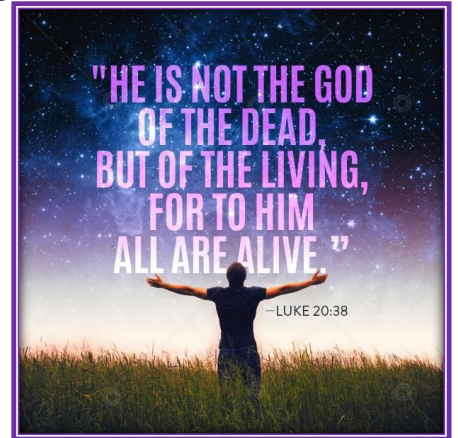

**Year C THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 6<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER 2022**

Gospel: Luke 20: 27-38

*He is God, not of the dead, but of the living.*

The season of remembrance is upon us. For most this is about looking backwards, to a world that has been. It is right that we give thanks and pray for those who have died, who I have no doubt would want us to pray also for ourselves that we would not replicate the mistakes of the past. For those in Christ, remembrance has always to be looking forward to a world that is in the process of becoming. I'm writing this between All Saints (All Hallows) Day and All Souls Day both of which remind us that the saints and the faithful departed, though having died, are very much alive. The sceptic says that they are alive in our memories and warm thoughts. No, we protest. We say that in reality and objectively, the saints and the faithful departed are alive because their souls are immortal. It is God's intention that one day these souls will be reunited with their bodies, not the bodies of decay but new glorious bodies like Jesus' own resurrected body. Everything about the saints and the faithful departed fills us with hope, assurance, light and love, that we look forward to the future rather than mourn the past. The saints draw us beyond ourselves to contemplate higher things than this mortal life affords, and to cherish Jesus who is the same today, yesterday as tomorrow. We are conscious of being ushered into the same fellowship as them, members of the same heavenly family, gathered around the same table in the here and now, they in heaven we on earth. Between us and heaven and us, there is a real economy of grace, where their prayers for us and the prayers we ask of them, embolden us to walk their same path. Inspired by the conviction of their lives and the beatific vision which we know they already glimpse, we yearn to become more faithful disciples of Christ for the future. What is true of All Saints is true also of All Souls. The Heavenly Jerusalem is the church not only of the firstborn but of the spirits of the righteous made perfect. Though the faithful departed undergo whatever purgation and cleansing is necessary, all await the restoration of all things, the future fulfilment of God's Kingdom and the pledged state of blessedness. This is Jesus's promise to those who enter into loving relationship with Him, who acknowledging their need of God, trust in his victorious cross and resurrection. All our entrenched ideas of God and humanity, are overturned by Jesus' words today. '*God is not the God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all men are infact alive*'. Need anyone fear death? Only if we are destroying our soul and the soul of others. Reject the culture of death, and our contribution towards it. Embrace Christ. Acknowledge His saving grace. Give God the honour due to his Name. Celebrate His Risen Life which is our life as well.
