Gospel: Matthew 11: 2-11 Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?

Today is 'Gaudete' Sunday from our opening words, 'Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice'. Being joyful is of the essence of the Christian faith. It is a contradiction for a Christian to be miserable. It may even be impossible. Hard pressed, perplexed, persecuted, struck down.....all these things we may be, but they do not control us. They are just momentary afflictions. With St Paul we can say 'we do not lose hope'. Why? Because as he goes on to say 'the Lord is near'. Our investment is in a future



already assured through the Christ who holds all the portfolios. Yet we are caught in this in-between time.... between the first coming of Jesus and his return. During this time of patient expectation, the knowledge that our faith will be vindicated, refined through adversity, induces joy. The person who has been given a few months to live often acquires a new purpose and zest for life. Christians know this instinctively, but we do so, not because of life draining away but because of life coming in abundance. Did we not in our baptism put to death our old life in order to live with Christ? As if to drive home the needy invitation to rejoice, this week's advent candle even sports a different colour. So why is joy seemingly in short supply in our churches and in the wider Christian life? Nietzsche said that 'I might believe in the Redeemer if his followers looked more redeemed'. Clearly Nietzsche wasn't redeemed, so let's not take his words uncritically. A palpable sense of joy is not always facially expressed. Joy is a bit like water. Sometimes it has to run underground in order to surface. The well can be deep and dark before the bucket comes to light. 'With joy' the prophet Isaiah says 'you will draw water from the wells of salvation'. The wells of salvation... the infinite resources of God, the endless gift of life through His Son Jesus Christ...what better resource could there be? The life-giving water of the Holy Spirit is readily and freely available. Last week we heard how John the Baptist prepared the way for the One who baptises with the Holy Spirit. So why is joy dampened? The door is now open. Are our hearts? Is it that we do not give glory to Jesus, without whom no Spirit is poured out? Do we place our hope and desires on lesser things? Do we quench the very Spirit into whose name we are baptised? Are we fully entering into the relationship that being baptised into the name of the Father, Son and Spirit entails? John's baptism was all about repentance. Jesus' baptism on the other hand was about far more than repentance. It above all conveyed forgiveness and the consequent joy of knowing where freedom can be found. Jesus says to his followers, I have told you these things so that you will be filled with my joy. Yes, your joy will overflow'. Gaudete! Fr Julian
