

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

18TH DECEMBER 2022

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24 Jesus is born of Mary who was betrothed to Joseph, son of David.

'Drop down dew from above you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Saviour'. These startling opening words of our mass from the prophecy of Isaiah remind us that there is no conception of Jesus without the impulse of heaven and the receptiveness of earth. The divine will of the Father and the responsiveness to that will, of Mary, the earthly mother let it happen. The activity of the Holy Spirit in bringing about the divine pregnancy is



likened to dew and rain. The prophet is straining to find words. They are used metaphorically of course to describe that which comes from above, not in the sense of the ceiling of the sky but the boundless dimension of heaven. Recently we were blessed from above not with dew and rain, but with snow and an abundance of it. We have almost to rub our eyes as the natural world covered itself in a glistening blanket. Its winter glory will fade. We cannot linger in what melts away even if we can enjoy it for a short time.' Sic transit Gloria mundi'...thus passes the glory of the world. These words were pronounced at papal 'coronations' for five hundred years before 1963. The procession leading the pope would stop three times. The master of ceremonies would turn to the pope, address him with these words and show him a slowly burning cloth. It reminded the pope that the glitz of this world is deceptive, and that only eternal things last. 'Let the Lord enter! He is the king of glory', proclaims the psalmist today. The cosmos was made by God for his glory but even it needs to acknowledge, receive and bless him. Ice and snow bless the Lord; praise him and magnify him for ever' thunders the words of the Song of the Three or the Benedicite. When we who are of the earth bless, blessings come to us and to the ground upon which we stand. The greatest blessing, we can give is the costly sacrifice of worship. Abel did this, Cain did not. In this fourth Sunday of Advent, our thoughts turn towards the response of a young Jewish maiden, who in offering herself to God sacrificially, was herself blessed through all ages as the mother of the Lord. Wherever her maternal blessing has been welcomed, it is as if the earth has opened itself to bring forth the Saviour. I'm writing this on the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Mexico turned away from human sacrifice, and the worship of the sun and moon, when it welcomed Mary, the one clothed with sun, with the moon at her feet and the mother of the One sacrificed to end all blood sacrifices. Is not the prophecy of Walsingham that our little plot of land will be blessed in coming to faith as we recognise, like the Mexicans, her claims as our Mother? Mary is the greatest evangelist of the Church, having led and still leading countless souls to her Son. Jesus is God Emmanuel-God with us- because she, the new Eve in Christ, daughter of the earth yet mother of all the living, first opened herself up to the spiritual dew and clouds from above. May we do the same and welcome the King who comes. And what is the blessing of Mary? It is the gift of Jesus Christ. Fr Julian
