Gospel: John 1: 1-18 The Word was made flesh, and lived among us.

The other day I was in a bookshop seeking some Christian literature. The manager showed me an area on the floor, under the bottom shelf and out of view. 'We had to move it for the Christmas items,' he said. He looked embarrassed realising the irony of his words. How can you have Christmas without Christ? The marginalisation of Christ's birth, its divorce from the very festivities that it occasions, is nothing new. We have become used to the toxicity of political correctness that

encourages the celebration of winter rather than the celebration of Christ, the author of winter. How could the simplicity of the nativity scene be an affront in public space? Admittedly a shack providing shelter for a homeless couple and a new born babe might diminish the latest fashion or fads, but the real reason is that it is too religiously charged for this scrupulous age. Over twenty years ago, at the approach of the millennium, I asked Madame Tussauds if they would be interested in creating a Nativity tableau to sit under the large portico of our parish church, just a few yards down the road. Their response was that they could not possibly promote a particular religion, apart from the fact that it would cost over twenty thousand pounds (apparently over one hundred and fifty thousand pounds now) to create a single effigy. Jesus, the central figure of human history, whose Jewish facial features are unknown to us, was not deemed relevant to the millennium celebrating his birth, and he certainly was not welcome in the hall of fame. We should neither be surprised or despair. Our Lord was the object of betrayal and rejection throughout his life. The validity of the gospel doesn't depend upon public spectacle, political edict or lubricating lucre. If we are to accompany the shepherds and the magi to Bethlehem then we need to surrender all our false images of God and turn the status of being a celebrity, wealthy, religious or powerful on its head. As Graham Kendrick addresses Christ in one of his songs, 'You came from the highest, reached down to the lowest.... You came from the brightest, to light up the darkest... You came from the kindest, to suffer the cruellest.....You came from the purest, to die for the foulest. You are the message of love'. The author of the cosmos entered into its very substance, into our frail human flesh, in the greatest act of self-giving love, exposing himself to all the vulnerabilities and vagaries of our human existence. Why? So that we might live from the inside out, insiders, totally fulfilled in outward going relationship, revealing his new creation and heralding the dawn of a new age to a world hopelessly lost in its own imaginations. St John's invitation is as fresh today as it was when he wrote his prologue. 'To all' who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to all who believe in his name, who was born not of human stock, or the urge of the flesh, or the will of man but of God himself'. May the good news of the Saviour's birth increase our joy this Christmas time and evermore. Fr Julian
