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Gospel: Matthew 4: 12-23 The people that lived in darkness have seen a great light.

In his first letter to the Corinthians from which our epistle reading is taken today, St Paul encourages the Corinthian Church to 'make up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice'. Whatever these disagreements were, they had become horribly factional, since Paul accuses the Corinthians of becoming partisan, making cult figures out of the various apostles from whom they had received the gospel...some for Apollos, some for Paul, some for Cephas. We know that there were different ways in which these figures operated, and as personalities, they differed also. They may have emphasised also different aspects of the Christian life. Paul wanted the Corinthians to look beyond these



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differences and not to forget the unity that they have in 'belief and practice'. His words are very pertinent for us. There are some who might be inclined to sow division in the Catholic Church today. We should treasure the beliefs and practices which strengthen our collective identity as catholic, beliefs and practices which should not divide us, but which we should nurture and uphold. What he says is of timely relevance also, is it not, in this current Octave of prayer for Christian Unity? Admittedly practices are divergent among Christians, though not widely so, and today we are more tolerant than in previous ages. This is partly because of the legacy of bridge building after Vatican II, greater involvement in social mission together, and an increased transmission of the treasury of Christian spirituality. Many of the ecclesial communities have altered their beleaguered stance towards the Mother Church, while she has reimmersed herself in the practices of the early Church, such as the centrality of the Word, the use of the vernacular, receiving in two kinds and the enablement of the laity, which are the bedrock of the ecclesial communities and which had been at the heart of their original separation from the Mother Church. These practices had always been espoused by the Mother Church but tended to be less emphasised or practiced than what they should have been. Moreover, Mother Church has always held that unity in Christ does always entail uniformity in practice, as can be seen in the ways in which she accommodates the different liturgical rites of the Eastern Churches, the Ordinariate and others. If this is the case with practices, surely beliefs require a uniformity. If we were to go for the lowest common denominator, according to Our Lord we cannot enter the kingdom of God unless 'by water and the Spirit'. Baptism in the name of the Father, Son and Spirit is the defining mark of the Christian faith, underscored by the fact that if anyone enters into Mother Church from one of the ecclesial communities, their baptism is recognised retrospectively as catholic. But Christian faith is much more than baptism. Surely acceptance of the Catholic Creeds is non-negotiable. We may not understand their profundity, but they provide us with a shared platform of belief, which divides Christian off from other beliefs. It should warm our hearts to think that in most places of Christian worship, belief in the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church is publicly professed. Let us not however fudge the issue. Beyond the credal basics, there are considerable differences in what Christians hold credal and credible, and these differences have to be recognised if dialogue is authentic. A vague soup of comprehensiveness makes one only sick. The crucial thing is not to lose sight of the all-important fact that we are all on a journey towards fuller communion, and that there is One who wills all his followers to be in unity. Jesus prays that we shall all be one. He doesn't say uniform. God didn't make a monochrome universe. Ultimately unity is all about Christ. As our communion antiphon proclaims today, if we follow the Light of the World, we will never 'walk in darkness but have the light of life'. Fr Julian
