



Year A FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Gospel: *Matthew 5: 1-12 How happy are the poor in spirit.*

The octave of prayer for Christian Unity may have drawn to a close, but the desire to pray for unity remains. It was one of the last prayers that Jesus prayed to his Heavenly Father before going to his death... 'may they all be one so that the world may believe that you have sent me'. Unity however cannot be sought at the expense of truth. The temptation to

seek popularity with the prevailing culture and to water down the faith is ever present. As the adage goes, the Church which is married to the spirit of the present age will be a widow in the next. The present age is obsessed by identity, and it seems that everyone is carving out their own identity. Our identity is found in Christ, not in the shifting sands of my assumed ability to re-invent myself. Through an encounter with Jesus, through his love, forgiveness and mercy we begin to understand that our true identity is fashioned only in relationship with him. We find who we really are only when we discover who He really is. This leads us to see also the dignity of others regardless of how they or we see themselves. All of us are damaged goods and we all need the heavenly make-over to restore our true identity. We have to give way therefore to the restoration process, and not bend truth, as if we could, to serve our own interest. Through the stripping away of ourselves before the cross, we are confronted with the identity of God and of ourselves. The word identity comes from *idem*, meaning the same, so we discover our true identity in our maker, in our sameness with him, that we are made in his image. God wants us to share the life of heaven and to seek his righteousness, instead of our own satisfaction. He calls us to sacrificially offer up our brokenness, and the world's. We find that divine happiness doesn't rest in trying to make myself happy by reinventing myself but in discovering my true self within the life of heaven. Since humans are made for heaven, it goes without saying that to be truly blessed is to be truly human. As the One who is above all truly blessed and truly human Jesus reveals pre-eminently the life of heaven and of a redeemed humanity. The Beatitudes, which he presents to us today, reflect the blessedness of that life. These beautiful attitudes, Jesus reveals pre-eminently, and he calls us to eagerly seek them. We find that our true happiness is found not outside of Christ, but only in communion with him. This is not what the world wants to hear. Governments and social pundits are endlessly trying to discover what makes people happy. Without reference to God they are wasting their time. It is like the search for the elusive elixir. If we find Jesus, or rather if he finds us, then we have found Beatitude itself. In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus invites us to reject the apostasy of the age, the idolatry of false identifications and embrace the opposite of the world's values. Acknowledge instead the identity of the True Man, and the vision of a restored humanity. Though persecution comes, 'rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven'. Fr Julian
