Year A THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

A few days ago, we celebrated the Feast of the Epiphany, the Journey of the Magi to Bethlehem. Epiphany means a showing forth, and it

celebrates the revelation of Jesus to the non-Jewish world, shortly after his birth. It was God's intention from the very beginning that the good news of salvation should be for outsiders as well as insiders. Tradition identifies three magi, or wise men, because of the number of gifts and often depicts them as from the Near East, Asia and Africa. Magi were known in different cultures, but these wise men may have come more locally from Persia, since there the magi were the priestly ruling caste of the Zoroastrians. Wherever they came from, they were seekers after the

truth. Not possessing the revelation of the chosen people, they sought guidance from their own religious inclinations and from their observation of divinely ordered nature. They were prepared to step out in faith to find Christ. Were they wise? Certainly not in worldly terms, for they were fortunate to escape with their lives, after turning up at Herod's court and pointedly asking, where is the real king of the Jews? Their wisdom was in that they desired divine truth, and sought the Christ child with courageous faith, trusting in the prophetic words that they heard. We celebrate their visit at Epiphany, together today with the Baptism of Christ. The Baptism opens up epiphany, not just as a revelation of Jesus' messiahship, but as a theophany, a manifestation of His divinity. The Baptism of Christ is one of the great Trinitarian feasts, when all three persons of the Trinity touch the natural world...the word of the Father, the self-offering of the Son and the anointing of the Holy Spirit. No longer simply the long awaited one, prophesied by a voice in the wilderness, Jesus is now openly declared as divine by the Father and the Spirit. The Church also sees the Marriage at the Feast of Cana as an epiphany event, at which Jesus made the first 'sign', as St John puts it, of his true identity, through miraculously changing water into wine. But why stop there? Just as we can talk of the several advents of Jesus... his first coming, the coming of his ministry, his silent coming to us in our lives, his second coming at the end of time...we can say also that there are several epiphanies...his manifestation from the manger throne, at his baptism, through his words and miracles, the dawning epiphany of his truth in our lives and that final epiphany, in all his glory before whom every knee will bow and every tongue confess. And what of his Epiphany in us? Christ wants to dwell in us deeply to manifest his grace, truth, love, peace, joy, forgiveness and wholeness. It can only be through his empowerment. Through his incarnation, God is pleased to dwell within us and manifest himself in our lives, not in spite of, but through our very frailty and brokenness. Through our encounter with Christ, like the magi we are also on a journey, but a return journey in which we are being reassembled and re-integrated, where we see ourselves and the world afresh as they did. We have been deeply touched and we discover our true selves and the true God by falling in love, in adoration and worship. That truly wise man, our father in the faith, Pope Benedict XVI, uttered as his last words 'Jesus I love you'. This is where all Epiphany ends and begins. Fr Julian

ENQUIRY INTO ASSISTED SUICIDE: The House of Commons Health and Social Care Committee has launched an inquiry into assisted suicide and is inviting participation from the public through answering a consultative paper with six questions. Assisted suicide presents profound dangers to public safety and the common good, and so it is crucial that as many people as possible engage with the inquiry and oppose the introduction of assisted suicide into UK law. The public response must be in by Friday 20 January. To aid public engagement, the Anscombe Bioethics Centre has produced a short two-page Briefing (at the back of the church) to help anyone interested in responding, whether as an individual or as an organisation.
