

Year A SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 12TH FEBRUARY 2023

Gospel: Matthew 5: 17-37 You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors; but I say this to you.

The terrifying impact of the earthquake in Turkiye and Syria reminds us of the power of nature and our vulnerability before it. Many people called upon the name of God, in fact upon his greatness, as buildings collapsed all around them. It is a natural instinct to cry out for mercy and to pray in the face of such adversity, for to whom can we turn but to One who is greater than all these things? Yet where is God in the face of such natural disasters? Jesus tells us that no sparrow falls to the ground without our 'Father knowing it'. We may assume therefore that no one perishes in an earthquake without God knowing it. Jesus doesn't say that God caused the sparrow to die, any more than God



doesn't say that God caused the sparrow to die, any more than God caused people to die in a natural disaster. The insurance world calls such disasters 'acts of God', but to what extent can we say they are acts of God? Even if they are, are there mitigating factors? An earthquake doesn't need to be particularly high on the Richter scale in order to cause maximum damage and loss of life... if an earthquake is shallow, if it happens when people are asleep, without warning and where there is poor infrastructure amidst a high density of population...all factors in this earthquake. In comparison, the earthquake in San Francisco in 1989, though relatively high on the scale, and in a heavily populated area, caused minimal damage and loss of life because of better infrastructure. The response to an earthquake is also important. Faced by natural disasters, in general, the poor suffer more often than the rich. Some of these disasters are certainly better described as acts of man, where human inequality and exploitation is at play. Disasters related to the climatic changes of recent years are directly the result of human activity. When the poor suffer disproportionately, people of faith should be particularly hesitant to rush to judgment and assume that God is punishing some city or people. Jesus warned us against assuming that the victims of disasters are sinners worse than ourselves. It is assumed similarly that there is a close corollary between sickness and sin, but the gospels carefully distinguish between those illnesses caused by sin and those which are not. When disaster or illness strikes our immediate response should be one of compassion and seeking to offer practical help, rather than an assumption that while we are safe, others have deserved what has come to them. This false sense of security is not unrelated to the attitudes of those whom Jesus comes up against in our gospel reading today. Jesus exposes their self-complacency as they assumed that they were fulfilling the demands of the commandments. His does this in three ways. In the first, he declares that he, rather than any person, is the fulfilment of the law. In the second, he extends what the law requires, such as in the case of divorce against the then easy granting of a divorce, and often to the detriment to the wife. In the third he shows that we cannot please God without a change of heart. He widens our capacity to infringe the ten commandments by showing that the offences which they dealt with, all extend from wrong attitudes in the heart. Their external demands have to be internalised. We need a change of heart if we are to be virtuous. In the light of this we are all law breakers and we need God's help. Consequently, Jesus invites us to develop an interior understanding of God's grace, mercy and love, to seek forgiveness and to free ourselves from the crippling tendency to measure ourselves against the performance of others. Only then can we seek to love God with all our heart, soul, strength and mind and our neighbour as ourselves. May this devastating earthquake shake us out of our complacency and through God's grace may we be led to repentance and the virtuous exercise of Fr Iulian compassion.
