

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

26TH FEBRUARY 2023

Gospel: Matthew 4: 1-11 Jesus fasts for forty days and is tempted.

Our readings today introduce us to the fall of man and our redemption through Jesus Christ. In the Old Testament reading we see paradise lost, and in the New Testament paradise regained. The disobedience of Adam and Eve is redeemed through the obedience of Jesus. The obedience of Jesus is also the main theme of our gospel reading, the temptation in the wilderness. Jesus undergoes a fierce spiritual battle in which he is tempted by the devil. In the first temptation, the devil tries to entice him not to trust God's word. In the second, he tempts him to put God to the test. In the third, he tries to allure Jesus away from the true worship of God. There is a logic in the progression and nature of these temptations. These were the very temptations to which the children of Israel succumbed, as they made their journey out of slavery towards the freedom of the



promised land. Instead of trusting God's word for his promises, they grumbled against God and his kindness. Next, they put God to the test at the waters of Meribah. Finally, at Sinai, they bowed down before a false god, the golden-calf of their own making instead of worshipping the one and only God. The people of Israel were God's chosen children, but the children of Israel had failed. Their battle ground was the wilderness. The landscape of defeat now becomes the landscape of victory. Here is Jesus, not only God's beloved son, but also a child of Israel, who succeeds where Israel failed. It was as if the shame of the past was being effaced. Israel's Messiah obediently confronts the power of darkness to turn towards the field of mission and his ultimate act of obedience in Jerusalem. The temptation in the wilderness belongs to the larger tapestry of Jesus' life-giving passion for us. Just as it was God's will that he underwent the cross, so it was God's will that he underwent the temptation. It was not the devil who led him into the wilderness, but the Holy Spirit. His sacrificial victory in the wilderness, an intimation of his final victory on the cross, strengthens us against the onslaught of the enemy, whether in our daily struggles to be obedient, or whenever we find ourselves plunged into the valley of testing. The temptations of Jesus are unique and those we will face will not be the same in degree or nature, yet as we decide to put God first, we also will invite attack. This season of lent is an opportunity to enter willingly into the fray. If we take its invitation seriously then we can expect a time of testing. I'm writing this on Ash Wednesday. Its closing vesper prayer asks the Lord to support us, as 'we begin our Christian warfare, so that in doing battle against the spirit of evil we may be armed with the weapon of self-denial'. Through repentance, confession and communion, and armed with the weapons of fasting, prayer and almsgiving, our spiritual muscle will be strengthened and hidden wells of rejuvenation will appear in the spiritual wilderness. We who have become the children of Israel by adoption, need not fall where they did, nor where our common ancestors Adam and Eve fell. Living on God's word (biblically and sacramentally), accepting His love wholeheartedly, rather than testing it or doubting it, and by rejecting the worship of false gods, we will grow in the midst of the spiritual conflict. After all Christ has already overcome the world, the flesh and the devil. Trusting in, what today's collect calls 'the riches hidden in Christ', we cannot but prevail. Fr Julian
