

Year A PALM SUNDAY 2ND APRIL 2023

Gospel: *The Passion according to St Matthew*

The triumph of Jesus' Resurrection awaits us but before that we must walk with him the final Way of the Cross. Today is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord which marks Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and into the last week of his life. Before the week is out we will have witnessed his cleansing of the temple, his last conflict with the religious authorities, his final teaching about the coming kingdom, his last supper with his disciples, his betrayal, his sham trial, his awful crucifixion and his burial in the



tomb. There is a logic to this progression. No Easter without Good Friday and Holy Saturday. No glory without the cross and burial. Do we understand this? Each and every one of us cannot access the benefits of His grace unless we are prepared to recognise His death. Think of two crosses. One is empty. Jesus is triumphant. The other has a corpus-Jesus hangs on the cross for my sins. We need both cross and crucifix, but prior is the crucifix. Venerating his cross is to recognise his atoning death...that he paid the price for my sins and willingly underwent the punishment for my rebellion. Venerating his cross is to surrender myself into his hands...my body, my work, my time, my talents, my resources. He is asking me to die with him, in order to rise with him. Anything else is cheap grace, grace that presumes on the benefits of God without any obligation on our part. Dietrich Bonhoeffer, martyred by the Nazis, described cheap grace as 'the sacraments, the forgiveness of sin, and the consolations of religion... thrown away at cut prices. the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, communion without confession, absolution without personal confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate'. Costly grace on the other hand 'is costly because it calls us to follow...Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life. It is costly because it condemns sin, and grace because it justifies the sinner. Above all, it is costly because it cost God the life of his Son: "you were bought at a price," and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us. Above all, it is grace because God did not reckon his Son too dear a price to pay for our life, but delivered him up for us'. The events of Holy Week present me with an opportunity to get my priorities right. To give Christ his due and to put Him first. He gave everything for me. What will I give to Him? Will I acknowledge his unfathomable divine mercy? Will I dethrone the idols in my life? Will I reject whatever keeps me from accepting his amazing grace? Will I be faithful in obeying his commands starting with the most basic, such as attending mass? Do this in remembrance of me? Will I honour Him by being present with my brothers and sisters and by heeding his word? Or will I be with the traitors who cry crucify, away with him and them? Will I choose my own way, the way of death, rather than life? Or will I choose my Saviour's love for me, "love to the loveless shown that they might lovely be? Fr Iulian
