

#### FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

**26<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2023** 

Gospel: John 11: 1-45 I am the resurrection and the life.

The raising of Lazarus is not like the resurrection of the dead proclaimed in our creed each week. This is because Lazarus would die again, as would the son of the widow of Nain, and the daughter of Jairus, both of whom Jesus raised also from the dead. Hopefully, like them, Lazarus survived for many more years before finally succumbing to natural death a second time. When Jesus miraculously raised the three of them respectively, their bodies were still subject to decline and decay. They were raised not as glorious



spiritual bodies, as they will be at their eventual resurrection, but as the same mortal bodies which they had before. Their bodies could not materialise and immaterialise as Jesus' glorious resurrection body did after his Resurrection. As they eventually died a second death, they now await the resurrection of the dead, as all the dead do, and as one day we ourselves will, after our own death. This is regardless of whether we believe it or not. Uniquely Jesus has already been raised from the dead, never to die again. As we also say in the creed, he will return to judge the living and the dead. Everyone will be raised from the dead without exception, some, Jesus tells us, to life, others to condemnation. Jesus' own Resurrection is the lynchpin of our Christian belief. It is impossible to be a Christian unless you believe it. It is at the heart of the good news. As St Paul said 'If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved'. However, at this stage in the events leading up to Holy Week only Jesus knew what was going to happen to him three days after his own death. Although he mentioned his own resurrection to his disciples, they wouldn't have understood what he meant by it. If they understood anything by resurrection, it would have been the conventional Jewish belief in the resurrection on the last day. Martha voices the same belief, that her brother would 'rise again at the resurrection on the last day'. Jesus however was not content that Martha should simply believe in a future resurrection. He draws her attention away from the future and indeed from her present grief, to his present self. Those who place their trust in him now are empowered with a measure of that power which would raise his very body three days after his own death, and which will eventually raise the dead at the end of time. Unequivocally he identifies himself as the one true God of the living, declaring, T am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die'. No one before or since has ever made a similar claim. Only in and through Jesus does humanity access that fulness of life, freedom, spaciousness, indeed eternal life, for which we crave. In this season of lent, as we walk the way of the cross, as we die to ourselves, as we give up and give away, let us remember that lent ultimately means one thing-Jesus' claims upon my life. He calls for my love, recognition and obedience. I shall have made a good lent if I acknowledge that I am not the Lord of my life, but that He is, and that I am called to entrust myself entirely into his hands. Jesus said to Martha, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God'. He says the same to us, and who would wish to ignore it? Fr Julian


