

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

5TH MARCH 2023

Gospel: Matthew 17: 1-9 His face shone like the sun.

The Transfiguration, when Jesus was transfigured before his disciples, teaches us much about prayer and worship. True worship is birthed in prayer, as we draw aside into the privacy of our hearts to commune with heaven. Jesus had taken his three innermost disciples with him to a place where they could be alone with him. If we are to enter into a deeper dimension of prayerful worship then we will be led by Jesus into a more receptive locality of heart and mind. He led the disciples up a high mountain, traditionally identified as Mount Tabor. Worship always has something of an ascension within it. We can't see the summit and we don't rationalise about it, but we know that we are being drawn into a more fulfilling, deeper relationship. Nothing could have prepared the disciples for what they experienced, when in their presence Jesus' face 'shone as the sun and his clothes became as white as the light'. What they saw, we ourselves will see only when we leave this mortal life. Being drawn into worship also illuminates the soul, though what the disciples saw was far greater than any illumination. Light radiated from Jesus' very body. His face shone like the sun. As they looked towards him, it must have been blinding. They must have turned away or shielded their eyes. They must temporarily have been plunged into darkness. The darkness caused by the brightness of light is not darkness conventionally seen or imagined.



Spiritually, the greatest Christian mystics explored its theme, reminding us that our relationship with God is sometimes couched in darkness. At times we may feel that he is absent, or that he has left us to fend for ourselves. This 'dark night of the soul' as St John of the Cross described it, is God's way of drawing us closer and enabling us to grow in faith. His poem 'Song of the Soul that is glad to know God by faith' derives its energy form the repetition of the theme of night, as in its opening lines: 'How well I know that fountain's rushing flow, though it be night. Its deathless spring is hidden. Even so full well I guess from whence its sources flow, though it be night. Its origin (since it has none) none knows, but that all origin from it arose, although by night'. The transfiguring light, emanating from Jesus' body, so glorious that it blinds, is the pre-existent light before the creation of the world. It is now made manifest in the flesh of the 'light of the world'. Speaking with Jesus are Moses and Elijah, the two main representatives of the Law and the Prophets. Jesus elsewhere will tell the disciples that he comes to fulfil both, and so suitably, Luke will tell us in his account of the transfiguration that Jesus converses with Moses and Elijah about the completion of his work in Jerusalem. The presence of those mortal from the past but alive to God (and visibly alive to the disciples) reminds us that the summit of our worship, the mass, is a celebration for the living and the 'dead'. Authentic worship transcends time and space, and breaches the veil between heaven and earth. So wonderful is it, that our instinct is to want to freeze it. Peter interjects, trying to capture it by building three shelters for Jesus and the prophets. Heaven's response is to invite Peter to a greater forgetfulness, to attune his spiritual hearing. The disciples are enveloped in a cloud of unknowing, yet glorious because instead of knowing by sight, they know now, audibly and spiritually. 'This is my Son, the Beloved...listen to him'. All authentic worship draws us to Jesus, the Word proclaimed and the Word made flesh. The disciples fell on their faces, overcome at the awesome presence of God. May we do the same. Fr Julian


