

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

23RD APRIL 2023

Gospel: Luke 24: 13-35 They recognised him at the breaking of bread.

Our gospel reading today is the story of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. A traveller joins them and walks alongside them. They do not realise that the traveller is Jesus, even though they discuss the recent events in Jerusalem, leading to his death and resurrection. Only later, as Jesus breaks bread with them, do they recognise him. Much in this story is a parable of life. As we step out on life's journeys, we may think we know the broad landscape, yet much remains uncertain. Encountering others, walking the same way, though not for the same reasons, often opens to us the deeper meanings of life. We discover more about ourselves and the world around us. The greatest discovery and journey we can make is into the heart of God. The Emmaus story reminds us that Jesus walks alongside us even when we do not



recognise him. In the divine economy we entertain angels unaware, so we can be sure that in the mystery of encounter, grace operates to draw us closer to God in unexpected ways. True journeying is an outward and inward pilgrimage, where we are confronted with the illusion of worldly appearances and the truth of divine love. As the disciples walked to Emmaus they were downbeat at the seeming contradiction of everything they had lived through and for. Why did Jesus have to die? Why have all their aspirations come to nought? All these cul-de-sacs and dead ends. They had heard reports of the empty tomb, but they had not yet begun to accommodate this into their immediate loss and confusion. In the journey of life, we cannot sidestep the transience of material things, the reality of finality, and the intimations of our mortality, but the gospel reassures us that death has not the last word. The human soul is meant for immortality. It longs for this reality, but of its own strength and volition it can never attain it, even though we search for it endlessly and often through many diversions. To find what we are really searching for, the human soul has to entertain God who is unknown to it, but who knows it better than itself. The soul cannot find God, so God 'finds' it, in ways which are often hidden from us. The soul first welcomes, often unconsciously, God into its company. It listens to his Word, and begins to question the presuppositions by which it has lived. Did not our hearts burn within us as he talked to us on the road and explained the scriptures to us? For the two disciples that realisation came later. As Jesus was conversing with them, he was opening to them a landscape of truth previously unperceived and horizons unrealised. They had returned home and yet were soon to discover that their home was elsewhere. The crucial turning point was inviting Jesus through the front door and sharing with him a meal. It was when Jesus was at table with them, when he took the bread, blessed, broke it and handed it to them that their eyes were opened. His company was what mattered. Accompaniment means ad cum panis, breaking bread with each other, so true accompaniment is when we allow Jesus to break bread for us. Through holy communion we discover not only who Jesus is, but who we are, and where all our meanderings find their meaning, or as we often sing here in holy mass, 'Bread of Life, Truth eternal, broken now to set us free'. Martyr, Patron of England St George was a brave martyr who was victorious over the devil. He was a soldier in the army of the Roman Emperor
