



SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

21ST MAY 2023

Gospel: John 17: 1-11 Father, glorify your Son.

A few days ago, we celebrated the Ascension, forty days after Jesus' Resurrection. The Ascension can be seen as Jesus' re-entry into the non-dimensional life of heaven. We are limited by living in a four-dimensional world of space (height, width and length) and time. When Jesus asks his Father to restore to him to that state which he had before the world began, he is of course asking to return to much more than the limited circumscriptions of our dimensional world. Heaven knows neither space nor time. Whenever we, with our limited faculties and bodies, put our trust in him and acknowledge his saving grace (confessing with our



lips that Jesus is Lord, and believing that God raised him from the dead) we experience a foretaste of the spaciousness of heaven. We cannot localise heaven, as our understanding of locality is limited by our understanding of space. Heaven is beyond our dimensional understanding. We can only experience it, as it is opened to us. When we pray that God's kingdom should come on earth as it is in heaven we are praying that God's power should break through into the dimensions of our world. Eternity is eternal because it is not bound by these worldly dimensions of space or time. This is why it is a condition of inestimable freedom. If the Son of Man makes you free, you shall be free indeed. Jesus' return bestows on those who believe in Him without limitation, the gift of freedom, the gift of the Holy Spirit, who imparts the spaciousness of heaven and prepares us for it. This spaciousness is a spaciousness of incredible glory. Being open to heaven is being open to the glorious infinity of God. So much of today's gospel passage highlights glory. In just eleven verses Jesus uses the word six times, twice asking the Father to glorify him, with the glory he had before the foundation of the world, so that he himself will glorify the Father, just as he has glorified him during his earthly life. Glory belongs to God, and through Jesus, that glory is seen in man. It is seen in the fact that he has made us in his image, but even more so, when we are restored through his redemptive power. No man has been as fully alive as Jesus, but in as much as we are alive in Him, we share his glory as well. The 'glory of God is man fully alive, and the life of man is the vision of God', said St. Ireneaus. We were created for one thing only-the glory of God. Our motivation should be, as St Ignatius Loyola said, 'Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam.....for the greater glory of God and the salvation of humanity'. In today's gospel, Jesus makes a final statement about glory. It is that he himself has been glorified in his disciples. Remarkably, this is in spite of their waywardness, and in spite of his knowledge that on the morrow, they will desert him. This strengthens us in our resolve to soldier on and not lose sight of our destination in spite of our own setbacks and prevarications. We are comforted for our destiny is assured in the one Destined. As St Paul reminds us: 'we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit. This same Spirit, St Peter says in today's epistle, is the 'Spirit of glory', which rests upon those configured to our crucified Lord. Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ has ascended. The Spirit has come and ever comes! Glory to God in the highest! Fr Julian
