

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER
Gospel: John 14: 1-12

I am the Way, the Truth and the Life.

One of the delights of spring is being able to sense the freshness of creation bursting into new life. For Solzhenitsyn, the smell of rain-drenched apple tree in blossom, in the well of his tiny garden, hemmed in by five stories, was life-giving. Contrasted to prison, this was freedom. I believe ...the single most precious freedom that prison takes away from us' is 'the freedom to breathe freely as I now can'. When you have been imprisoned or forced



to work on labour camps for eight years, as he was (simply for criticising Stalin), it goes without saying that you value your basic freedom more. There are of course different kinds of prisons, and one does not need to be physically imprisoned to feel imprisoned. Sometimes we imprison ourselves, by our inability to be ourselves or to love others as ourselves. These prisons can be a lot more confining than the walls of a gaol. If we do not know inner freedom, it doesn't matter how much outer freedom we have, we are not free. 'Bring' my soul out of prison that I may praise your name' said the Psalmist. Unforgiveness, bearing resentment or bitterness lock us up. Mandela said that 'As I walked out the door toward the gate that would lead to my freedom, I know if I didn't leave my bitterness and hatred behind, I'd still be in prison'. Fear, low esteem and entertaining wrong ideas about ourselves also place us in detention. Crucially important are the life choices we make. Twear the chain I forged in life, 'said Marley's ghost to Scrooge. T made it link by link, and yard by yard; I girded it on of my own free will, and of my own free will I wore it. Is its pattern strange to you?'God has given us free will, to respond to him freely, to make those choices in life which would most bring us into a place of liberty. In his graciousness, He provides the way to escape and break free. At the start of his ministry at Nazareth, Jesus proclaimed, 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because the Lord has sent Me to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound.' Jesus' gift to his followers is infinite spaciousness, through the liberating love of the Father. God is not our enemy or stranger, but our loving heavenly Father. Jesus alone admits us into this wonderful freedom of knowing that we are infinitely loved. 'No one can come to The Father except through me'. Jesus takes us further still into the heart of God. The effects of the 'wonderful exchange' whereby he washes away our sins through his sacrificial death makes us as the offertory prayer today says, 'partakers of the one supreme Godhead'. We become subjects rather than objects of God's love. Heaven is described as the spaciousness of the Father's house...a house of many rooms, in which we can feel at home. Feeling at home gives us the ultimate sense of freedom, where we are most ourselves. Jesus then tells his disciples that after preparing for them a place, he will return to take them with him. He is referring not just to his return three days after his death but his eventual return in the Second Coming, which we proclaim in every mass. It is proclaimed also in all coronations. A monarch receives the crown until Christ its rightful owner returns. To Christ alone belongs the crown, the coronation, the throne, the glory, the majesty, the abbey, the liturgy, the anointing, the nation, the world. 'God save the King'! Fr Julian
