

Gospel: Matthew 10: 37-42

Anyone who does not take his cross is not worthy of me. Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me.

The film 'Cry Freedom' is the story of Steve Biko, the anti-apartheid activist who was put on trial by the South African authorities for advocating black consciousness. In court, the judge asked him why he used the term black, for 'you people are more brown than black'. Biko replied, 'Why do you call yourselves white? You people are more pink than white'. I am glad that Biko was more gracious than those who considered a five-year-old a safeguarding risk (a record which will remain until his secondary school ends) simply because he used the wrong colour to describe the skin of a fellow pupil. Education seems to have lost all sense of proportionality when it treats children like adults. No wonder children no longer know who they are. Racism however is a scourge, and it is back in the news with the appalling revelation that years after Stephen Lawrence's racially inspired murder, evidence has now come to light, which was



conveniently dismissed by authorities at the time. As today's psalm says, we look to God's justice, not our own, as the source of our happiness. In the alternative gospel acclamation, from St Peter, we are told that 'You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a people set apart to sing the praises of God who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light'. Regardless of our feelings, perceptions, or the colour of our skin, such is our status in Christ. The attributes of the chosen people are now attributed to the followers of Christ. That doesn't mean that we have displaced 'our elder brother', as St John Paul II described the Jews of the old covenant. It means that through the grace of God we share in their inheritance. St Paul makes this very clear in his Epistle to the Romans. Yet what does a 'chosen race' mean? Surely this introduces a racial theme, alien to our faith. Would it not be better to say 'chosen people' or 'chosen generation', as we find in other translations? The Jewish people were never a separate race. Over the centuries the racist abuse directed towards them, has come precisely from the fact that they were seen as a separate race, when they were not. Their separateness stems from their covenantal relationship with God, not from any supposed racial identity. Abraham the father of our faith is described as a wandering Aramean, who hails from Ur of the Chaldees in modern Iraq. Moses marries a Cushite woman whose skin may have been black. The Jews were permitted to marry interethnically, so long as the marriage was in the faith. We see this in Jesus' genealogy, where four Gentiles are named as having married Jewish men: the Canaanites, Tamar and Rahab; Ruth, a Moabitess and Bathsheba a Hittite. This highlights the future mission of the Church to call all the non-Jewish peoples of the world into covenant with God. It reminds us also that we share Christ's love through colour-blind eyes. The last book of the bible, the Apocalypse highlights the ethnic mix of the Church, for we see that Christ has redeemed people from 'every tribe and language, people and nation'. Amazingly, on seven occasions in its chapters we find this fourfold grouping of multi-ethnicity. As four is the number of the world, and seven is the number of completeness, God's kingdom in its fullness is going to be incredibly kaleidoscopic. There will be many shades of skin colour. 'All peoples, clap your hands. Cry to God with shouts of joy'.

CAFOD Campaign - On the weekend of 15th/16th July, the plan is to ask parishioners to sign a giant letter from Salina, an organic farmer and seed saver in

Bangladesh, asking the World Bank to help people in her community and other countries in the Global South to help small-scale farmers to have their rights upheld, so that they can use their own seed varieties and ensure long-term food security and climate resilience. Rather than supporting these farmer-led seed systems, the World Bank has been pushing an agricultural model which benefits big agribusiness at the expense of small farmers. These seeds are more expensive, demand more chemical inputs (further increasing the cost)!

The Chinese state imposes forced abortion, sterilisation and infanticide on its own population, notably the Uyghur minority. According to the Chief Commissioner of the Independent Commission for Aid Impact, the UK Government sent over £60 million to China in 2020-21. St. Thomas was a Jew, called to be one of the twelve Apostles. At the Last Supper, when Christ told His

Apostles that He was going to prepare a place for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is "the Way, the Truth and the Life." But, St Thomas is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of his Master. Thomas's unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday merited for him the title "doubting Thomas." He is the patron saint of architects.
