

CORPUS CHRISTI

11TH JUNE 2023

Gospel: John 6: 51-58 My flesh is read food and my blood is real drink.

There are many ways in which Jesus is present to his Church. He is present whenever two or three are gathered in his name. He is present in the poor, the sick and imprisoned of his brothers. He is present in the sacraments of which he is the author. He is present as the occupant, in those who have responded to his invitation to set up home in their lives. He is present in his Word wherever it is proclaimed. Yet if we were to identify where Jesus makes himself most present, it would be as the catechism affirms, 'most especially in the Eucharistic species'...or in other words, in his body and blood under the guise of the consecrated bread and wine. This is what today's solemnity celebrates, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, otherwise known as Corpus Christi. This ancient feast invites us to stand back and consider the wonder of what is at the heart of each celebration of the holy eucharist and of every adoration before the holy tabernacle...the real presence of the Lord. The catechism reminds us that the mode of Christ's presence in the blessed sacrament of the Eucharist is unique, for within it, 'the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really and



substantially contained'. To say that Christ's presence is real does not exclude other types of presence, as if they were not real. It means that he is present in the fullest sense.... Christ 'makes himself wholly and entirely present'. 'This is my body...this is my blood'. How he makes himself present, has exercised the minds of many throughout the generations and inevitably so, as it is both mystery and miracle. What we can say is that the combined action of the Word of Christ and the Holy Spirit transform ('transubstantiate') the bread and wine into Christ's body and blood. This has nothing to do with human agency. St John Chrysostom writes that, 'It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but he who was crucified for us, Christ himself. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God's. This is my body, he says. This word transforms the things offered'. St Ambrose puts it like this. 'Be convinced that this is not what nature has formed, but what the blessing has consecrated. The power of the blessing prevails over that of nature, because by the blessing nature itself is changed...Could not Christ's word, which can make from nothing what did not exist, change existing things into what they were not before? It is no less a feat to give things their original nature than to change their nature'. Liturgically, Jesus, the Word proclaimed at the lectern and altar, is manifested as the Word made flesh in the liturgy of the eucharist. As the catechism affirms, the two parts of the liturgy...the liturgy of the Word and the liturgy of the eucharist...are 'one single act of worship', for 'The Eucharistic table set for us is the table both of the Word of God and of the Body of the Lord'. Word and Body engender faith, and by faith they are to be received. As St Thomas Aquinas reminds us in his great hymn, Pange Lingua in the eucharist, Word made Flesh, by word he maketh Very bread his Flesh to be; Man in wine Christ's Blood partaketh: And if senses fail to see, Faith alone the true heart waketh To behold the mystery'. The miracle takes place regardless of our faith, but faith welcoming and trusting in Jesus' words, is the only understandable response to the One who gives us not just the consolation of his Body and Blood, but his very Soul and Divinity as well.
