

Gospel: *Matthew 15: 21-28 Woman, you have great faith.*

God desires that all peoples should be saved and come to know and love Him. His plan from eternity was that this should be through the sacrificial gift of his Son, born to a people that would prepare for his coming by entering into a special 'covenant' relationship with God in order to reveal his loving faithfulness to the world. The chosen people of the Old Testament were not chosen because they were superior to others. They were chosen because God chose them. Likewise, the chosen people of the New Testament are chosen to



fulfil Jesus' mission to the rest of the world, not because we are worthier than others, but because God chose us: 'You did not choose me I chose you'. There can be no justification for feelings of superiority or self-pride, which can so easily lead to colonial and anti-Semitic tendencies. The calling of the Church 'the younger brother' does not invalidate the calling of 'the elder brother', as St John Paul II called the Jews. Though for the most part they did not welcome their Messiah, their rejection is only temporary, for, as St Paul reminds us today, God 'never takes back his gifts or revokes his choice'. As with all people, there is always a way back in repentance now that Jesus, the Jewish Messiah, has come. In its inception the Church was Jewish. It was among his own native people, that Jesus gathered a nucleus of faithful followers to take his mission into the Gentile (non-Jewish) world 'to make disciples of all nations'. Inevitably, then, during his own short earthly ministry of three years, his priority was to form that nucleus of Jewish disciples. Necessarily, much of his missionary endeavour was among the Jews. This is why Jesus says in the gospel today that 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel'. Today's gospel reading shows one of the occasions when Jesus encountered a non-Jew, a Canaanite woman, from the area of Syro-Phoenicia. Jesus initially appears unresponsive, uncharacteristically so, compared to other occasions when facing Gentile requests. But was his response that different? Jesus' response is always tailored to the individual circumstance. The woman might have been accustomed, like many neighbouring Gentiles, to call Jews dogs. There was little love lost between the ancient Canaanite people and the Jews, just as today, between the Palestinian people and the Jews. Jesus would know and appears to return the unsavoury compliment. Yet when Jesus says it is not right to throw the children's bread and give it to the dogs, he doesn't use the usual word for dog but one more akin to a household pet. This is a compliment. The Gentiles may not yet be seated at the banquet but they are in the house, and not outside. We have the audio but not the video. As the banter deepens, there is probably a smile on Jesus' face. He was, we can be assured, testing her faith. Was she prepared to acknowledge, in spite of her baggage of prejudice, God's prior providential calling of the Jews among the peoples of the earth? Are we? Her response is quite remarkable. Having called Jesus Son of David, she now recognises Jesus' divine calling ('Lord') as well as the call of the chosen people of God. It is only an act of mercy which allows her and others to benefit from the blessing of Abraham. We fellow Gentiles who have come 'to serve him and love his name' (as Isaiah prophesied we would in today's reading) should learn from her humility. Now that we also have become sons and daughters of the household of faith, how might we be more generous with those who hunger to sit at the table and yearn for the reality of life? Would Jesus recognise in us that quality which he saw in her, and which is often lacking in his disciples, the virtue of 'great faith'? Fr Julian

DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE
TO WALSINGHAM
Saturday 23rd September.
We have the chance to go on pilgrimage to Walsingham

with Cardinal Vincent and the Auxiliary Bishops. The theme of the Pilgrimage is 'Mary, Mother of the Home.' The theme is not dissimilar to the one for the Pilgrimage to Lourdes this year, focusing on Our Lady's call for a "Chapel to be built." In both senses, God is continually building up the People of God to journey with him on a pilgrimage of faith. The coach will leave the church at 8am, to get to Walsingham in good time for 12 noon Mass. After lunch we walk the Holy Mile and conclude with Benediction at the old Priory shrine. Please note there will be two collections during the day: one during the Mass which goes towards the upkeep and development of the Walsingham Shrine and a retiring collection after Benediction which also goes towards the cost of the day. We have a 49-seater coach, with a toilet. To book a place on the coach, please fill in the slip at the bottom of the newsletter and give it in with the £29 (£24 coach + £5 pilgrims' levy) cost, either as cash or

a cheque payable to 'St Augustine's Catholic Church,' to The Presbytery. The cut off date is the 9th September, so if you would like to go, please contact the presbytery to let us know.
