

ST AUGUSTINE'S PATRONAL

27TH AUGUST 2023

Gospel: *Matthew* 16: 13-20

You are Peter, and I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven.

The one city guaranteed eternity is Jerusalem, not the city manufactured by man but one fashioned by God. In the Apocalypse the language used to describe this New Jerusalem is identical to the bridal language used of the Church elsewhere in Holy Scripture. It also says that the walls of the New Jerusalem are raised on the twelve apostles. In today's gospel we see that Jesus singled out one of twelve, Peter, as the one upon whose shoulders this responsibility would primarily rest....'You are Peter and, on this rock I will build my Church'. We might think this is a bit of a gamble. Would we trust Peter, knowing his desertion and prevarications, to be the chief executive of our plans? We probably wouldn't, but Jesus did. Jesus chose him not for who he was, but for what he would become. It's the same for all of us if we work on God's building site. We are apprentices learning our trade, assured that God knows his architecture. Christ is our master builder, and we are his workmanship, knit together for the good of the whole. He delights in us and knows we are a work in progress. We make mistakes. Much downsizing and polishing has to take place. We can't dictate to God our own plans. While he gives u

sizing and polishing has to take place. We can't dictate to God our own plans. While he gives us to express the gifts and graces he has gifted to us, his designs are not ours. If we start building ourselves, by doing our own thing, then we are jerrybuilders. Throughout history disenchanted members of the Church have attempted to draw up their own constructions by replicating the materials of the building. The lean-to constructions built around national identities, state enforcement or prominent personalities will not survive the test of time. Stones we may be, but we will be less than living the life if we cut ourselves off from our apostolic foundations. The rock of Peter will not fall because it is divinely chosen. It may often need reformation and renewal but not redesigning. It may go through rough times and face betrayal from within, but as Jesus says, the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. Peter would eventually become rocklike, fulfilling the name that Jesus gave him. It's a name which quickly stuck among the apostles, as Paul, a relative outsider to the apostolic circle, would call Peter, Cephas, (the Aramaic equivalent for 'the rock') on several occasions. Perhaps Jesus was thinking of another rock also. For the Jews Jerusalem was the centre of the world, the place where God 's favour particularly rested. In the centre of the city, at its very heart, in its Temple, was a rock, which the Jews believed was central to the creation of the world. You can still see it today. The Dome of the Rock, with its golden cupola, covers it. Emblazoned with Islamic inscriptions, the cupola advertises a koranic verse which denies the historical death and resurrection of Jesus, and also his incarnation... 'it is not befitting to the majesty of Allah that He should take himself a child'. Nothing expresses the difference between Islam and the Christian faith as much as this. It strikes at the heart of what we hold dear. 'Who do you say that I am'.... this is the question Jesus put to his twelve disciples, just as he puts it to us today, people of faith or none. It was Peter who spoke up first. 'You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God'. To know the Son is to know the Father. Jesus told Peter that in knowing His Sonship he was blessed indeed. Such knowledge came not from any human understanding, but from 'my Father in heaven'. Revelation revealed it. The One, Catholic, Apostolic Church which our creed professes is built not on the shifting sands of public opinion, popular culture, political correctness, or privatised belief but the unadulterated truth of revelation. On which and whose building site are we building? Fr Julian

DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE WALSINGHAM Saturday 23rd September. We have the chance to go on pilgrimage to Walsingham

with Cardinal Vincent and the Auxiliary Bishops. The theme of the Pilgrimage is 'Mary, Mother of the Home.' The theme is not dissimilar to the one for the Pilgrimage to Lourdes this year, focusing on Our Lady's call for a "Chapel to be built." In both senses, God is continually building up the People of God to journey with him on a pilgrimage of faith. The coach will leave the church at 8am, to get to Walsingham in good time for 12 noon Mass. After lunch we walk the Holy Mile and conclude with Benediction at the old

Priory shrine. Please note there will be two collections during the day: one during the Mass which goes towards the upkeep and development of the Walsingham Shrine and a retiring collection after Benediction which also goes towards the cost of the day. We have a 49-seater coach, with a toilet. To book a place on the coach, please fill in the slip at the bottom of the newsletter and give it in with the £29 (£24 coach + £5 pilgrims' levy) cost, either as cash or a cheque payable to 'St Augustine's Catholic Church,' to The Presbytery. 
MARCH FOR LIFE UK will be held on the 2nd **September** and will start will Mass at 10.30am at Westminster Cathedral
