



# 25<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

24<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 2023

Gospel: Matthew 20: 1-16

Why be envious because I am generous? This weekend about thirty parishioners will be heading off to Walsingham for the annual diocesan pilgrimage. We have a special connection with Walsingham. Our south chapel is dedicated to Our Lady of Walsingham, and we have roundel highlighting the number of miles between Hoddesdon and Walsingham. Hoddesdon was the first staging post on the journey to Walsingham from London, and one of the many reasons why there were so many inns in Hoddesdon was to provide accommodation for the many pilgrims passing through. It's no credit to a recent book on the pilgrimage route that it doesn't mention the




town, nor the fact that one of its most famous pilgrims, Thomas More spent part of his life in neighbouring Roydon. The book is called the Camino to Walsingham but it didn't need to be titled that, as if Walsingham had to lean on the famous route to Santiago de Compostela. In the Middle Ages so many flocked to Walsingham that they were said to be as illuminous as the Milky Way. It was at Walsingham that Richeldis de Faverches had a vision of the Virgin who asked her to build a replica of the holy house Nazareth. England's Nazareth speaks of the incarnationnot only that in the ordinary human womb of Mary, Jesus was conceived, born and nurtured, as one of us, but that here in our landscape, in England's dowry those who come on pilgrimage will 'not go away empty handed'. That was Mary's promise to Richeldis in the eleventh century, and countless pilgrims throughout the succeeding generations have found it to be true. As Jesus' spiritual brothers and sisters, we are Mary's children, which is how the last book of the bible, the Apocalypse describes us. Just as she transcends any idea of earthly motherhood, so in her magnificat, she reminds us that we cannot carry into the kingdom of God the presuppositions of worldly distinctions. True equality is born of God the Father. Today's parable reminds us of the universal call to work in the vineyard of the Lord. All the citizens of the kingdom of God receive the same benefits, regardless of when they responded to the call. This is the impartial generous grace of our Father, who never runs out of pocket providing for his own. The parable talks of a daily wage, a minimum wage if you like, given indiscriminately to all the workers. And if this is just for one day, what generosity awaits those who work many days. The parable of course is not in the first place about work, pay or rewards, and it certainly wouldn't do much for industrial relations. It reminds us of the sheer privilege of being God's co-workers, and not to look at what we can get out of God but of what we can put in. Is there an equality in how we perceive our brothers and sisters in the faith? Last week I drew attention to the fact that generally it is a small percentage of the church congregations who carry the financial burden of the running costs. It may be the same here. What's equal about that? I know that some may not be in a comfortable position financially at present, but many are. What if we established an equality in our giving, so that some of our brothers and sisters are not unduly weighed down by the failure of the rest of us to give what is a proportionate for God's work and glory. Might we say the same of the giving of our time and talents as well. Some may not be in a position to volunteer their assistance but others are. There is much work to do in the vineyard. God wants to hire you! Fr Julian

## **FINANCE**

FINANCIAL RESULTS FOR 2022 are now available to view on the notice board on the back of the church, by the newspapers. During 2022, we did not cover our daily running costs and had an average deficit of £663 per week. Even though our total offertory has gone up by 24.4% over the last 3 years, the average weekly donation per person was £3.67. If you are in a position to give more, it would make a real difference. Just 32% of our total offertory and donations were gift aided. If everyone had gift-aided their donations, we would have received an extra £26,036 this year! If you pay tax, please do sign up for Gift Aid so that we can add 25% to everything that you give, at no cost to vourself. # SAINT OF THE WEEK

SS MICHAEL, GABRIEL, **RAPHAEL**, Archangels 29<sup>th</sup> September



The liturgy celebrates the feast of these three archangels who are venerated in

the tradition of the Church. Michael ("Who is like God") was the archangel who fought against Satan and all his evil angels, defending all the friends of God. He is the protector of all humanity from the snares of the devil. Archangel Gabriel ("Strength of God") announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people. Archangel Raphael ("Medicine of God") is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey.
