

Gospel: Matthew 16: 21-27

If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself.

Famously, in answer to a question in the Times, 'What is wrong with the world?' G.K.Chesterton wrote 'Yours sincerely, I am'. He did not blame others or objectivise his culpability, but recognised that he was implicated. The resolution to the world's problems lies within each of us. It's not the world which is at fault but the people in it, you and me. Some might ask the same question of the Church. What's wrong with the Church? The answer is the same...'Yours sincerely, I am'. We are its living stones. We have no existence beyond ourselves, so judgement and renewal begin with us. If we reflect



with honesty on the history of the Church, then we see so much wondrous grace but also, we have to admit, episodes of the deepest darkness. Did Jesus not say that wheat and tares grow together? On occasions, much inhumanity and evil has been done in the name of Christ, by those professed to be Christians, even by those in the highest positions of trust and responsibility. Judas has had many disciples, who like him, have been blinded by their own sense of rectitude or deception and in so doing betrayed our Lord to death. Today's gospel reading is a pertinent reminder of the subtlety of evil. Last week Jesus called Peter the rock on which he would build his Church. This week he gives him a stern rebuke. Why was Jesus so severe, considering that Peter, we may assume, only had Jesus' interest at heart? Peter's thinking was along the lines of... That kind of thing doesn't happen to the Messiah. It's unworthy of the Son of God. You will be welcomed in Jerusalem. Your ascendancy will be easy. The religious authorities clearly have a difference with you, but they won't do that kind of thing. It is preposterous to say that You will have to suffer grievously and be put to death. Anyway, we disciples will try to prevent that taking place. We would not allow it.... Why was such thinking so offensive to Jesus, so offensive, in fact, that he calls Peter, Satan? Peter was not Satan, but what Jesus heard were words which belonged more to the devil than to one of his followers. Peter did not realise the depths of depravity to which humanity can descend. The religious leaders would rather see Jesus dead then welcome the good news of God's kingdom. They had no room for repentance in their heart. They wanted Christ only in as much as he confirmed them in their self-complacent, selfperpetuating existence. Holding onto power was more important for them than welcoming God's truth. They would, of course, play their crucial part in the unravelling drama of salvation. It was Jesus's destiny to die at Jerusalem. He told his disciples that 'he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes'. His ignominious death, which would open the floodgates of salvation, was God's way of saving humanity from the clutches of Satan and establishing the kingdom of God. Peter's way of thinking was evil because his thinking was not God's way. Man's mind, if not redeemed, is open to Satan's influence. Modern man has seriously misinterpreted and underestimated God. He has little reference or reverence for God. He thinks he has no need for salvation because he sees no need to repent and has lost his moral compass. This kind of thinking so prevalent today might influence us also. Are we self-serving or Christ serving? Do we model the world's behaviour, or Christ? Have I chosen the cross or have I decided that I would rather invincibly walk into the dark? Have we forgotten God's merciful love? Fr Julian

DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE
TO WALSINGHAM
Saturday 23rd September.
We have the chance to go on
pilgrimage to Walsingham

with Cardinal Vincent and the Auxiliary Bishops. The theme of the Pilgrimage is 'Mary, Mother of the Home.' The theme is not dissimilar to the one for the Pilgrimage to Lourdes this year, focusing on Our Lady's call for a "Chapel to be built." In both senses, God is continually building up the People of God to journey with him on a pilgrimage of faith. The coach will leave the church at 8am, to get to Walsingham in good time for 12 noon Mass. After lunch we walk the Holy Mile and conclude with Benediction at the old Priory shrine. Please note there will be two collections during the day: one during the Mass which goes towards the upkeep and development of the Walsingham Shrine and a retiring collection after Benediction which also goes towards the cost of the day. There are now only 4 spaces left on the coach. To book a place, please fill in the slip at the bottom of the newsletter and give it in with the £29 (£24 coach + £5 pilgrims' levy) cost, either as cash or a cheque payable to 'St Augustine's Catholic Church,' to The Presbytery. The cut off date is the 9th September.
