



Gospel: Matthew 22: 1-14

Invite everyone you can find to the wedding.

Regardless of whether we are single or married, separated or divorced, ultimately there is only one vocation. It is marriage. The whole of biblical testimony points to this, as does our mass. The penultimate chapter of the bible talks about the appearance of the bride adorned for her husband. The name of the last book of the bible, the Apocalypse, even takes its name from the act of unveiling of the bride (the *apocalypsis*) in a marriage ceremony. Otherwise known as Revelation, the book is about the final triumph of the Church, finally revealed in all her splendour as the bride dressed in preparation for her



bridegroom, the husband, for whom she has long awaited. Throughout his teaching ministry Jesus used the imagery of the bridegroom for himself. Israel, the chosen people, would recognise the allusion. In the Old Testament God had wished to enter into a close relationship with his people so that they would become a partner fit for his affections. Though they prevaricated and wandered away, God was always true to his side of the covenant and the prospect of marriage never nullified. Consequently, the theme of the marriage banquet frequently appears in Jesus' teaching, as it does today. In the gospel today, Jesus invites us to consider ourselves, not as the bride, but as the guests invited to the wedding. 'The wedding is ready, but those invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding'. Originally addressed only to Israel, the invitation is now universal. In a different wedding parable, Jesus invites us to identify as the attendants, waiting for the return of the bridegroom. Some are ready and others are not. Whether attendants or guests, having the necessary accoutrements.... the wedding garment or sufficient oil...is essential. The wedding invitation is freely given, and has to be accepted, but entering into its spirit is all important. What marked out the wedding guest was ultimately the wedding garment, not the acceptance of the invitation. Perhaps we can see in the wedding garment an allusion to the white baptismal robe in which we are vested after our baptism. In the early church people would take off their clothes, enter the font of immersion, come out the other side and be vested in a new white garment, to show that their baptism into Christ means death and resurrection, changed priorities and the re-orientation of their lives. The wedding garment then is like the robe of righteousness, not our own righteousness, but Christ's righteousness, given to all who take their baptism promises seriously, worked out in lives of repentance and cooperating with God, rather than working against Him. As the baptismal liturgy alludes, this spiritual investment should be kept unsoiled, through the continuous cleansing power of grace. Receiving forgiveness and extending it, through partaking in regular communion and reconciliation, allows Christ's cleansing power to work. To reject our baptismal promises, is to reject Jesus and to deprive ourselves of a seat at the marriage banquet. The guest who becomes the bride is yet to be revealed, but in holy mass we see how the transformation is being realised. Through our communion, we participate in the foretaste of Jesus' marriage banquet and the prospect of much more. For who can understand, as St Paul says, what God has in store for those who love him? What groom and bride stay in the banqueting hall? Are they not to become one and enjoy life together for ever? This is why we pray at the offertory and after the communion today, that our participation in Jesus' body and blood will open to us not only the glory of heaven and but our sharing in His divine nature. That surely is the consummation of eternity. Fr Julian

PRAYER & LITURGY


MARK WIPPERMAN of The Knowle, died recently. His funeral will be on Wednesday 18th October at 11am at Woollensbrook Crematorium.

SOCIETY FOR THE PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN (SPUC) write to say that Abortion providers are again ramping up their attempts to decriminalise abortion ... The Abortion providers, '... are using the case of women who are being prosecuted for illegal late-term abortions to make their case. The trial of Carla Foster was the first to come to the public attention ... who was sentenced to imprisonment after it was found that she lied to abortion provider BPAS to obtain abortion drugs well

past the legal limit for abortion. Her daughter Lily was born dead



at 32-34 weeks' gestation.' There are now several other cases before the courts ... what all these cases have in common is that they have happened since abortion giants like BPAS started sending women abortion drugs in the post, without proper checks! SPUC have produced a postcard that makes it easy for people to send a message - campaign calling on the Health Secretary to end this deadly policy.
