

#### 29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**22ND OCTOBER 2023** 

Gospel: Matthew 22: 15-21

Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.

Our gospel today is Jesus' encounter with the Pharisees when they try to trap him by asking Jesus whether it was right to pay taxes to Caesar or not? Jesus asks for a coin and asks them whose head and name was on it. Caesar, they reply, to which Jesus then says, 'Render unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's, and unto God the things that are God's'. Unfortunately, the lectionary leaves out the most important verse, the last one, which provides the key to the whole episode: 'When they heard this, they were amazed. So, they left him and went away'. Jesus' response had clearly amazed his opponents. Yet there is nothing amazing about Jesus' response, if we take at face value the usual way of interpreting this verse. The interpretation runs like this. Jesus had avoided implicating himself as a roman collaborator, while not denying Caesar his dues, and not explicitly answering the question. Yet Jesus didn't need to show them a coin in order to make this



point. Everyone knew that Caesar claimed his dues. What is so amazing about that? The point is surely this. The Pharisees who posed the question prided themselves on being upholders of the Torah. They had planned to trap Jesus into undermining the authority of Rome. Instead Jesus trapped them into the self-confession that they were undermining an altogether higher authority, as was evident from both their answers. Roman coinage was covered with bombastic claims of Caesar's divinity. No man, however exalted, had any right to them. They belonged only to God. In saying that the titles were Caesar's, they cast themselves as blasphemers. At the same time the Pharisees had forgotten their Genesis. Man is made not in his own image but in the image of God. The coin did not have Caesar's inscription and image on it because the copyright of both belonged to God, not to Caesar. Rather than being a discourse over imperial taxation, Jesus had recalibrated it, so that it was now about the source and use of authority. The usual interpretation tells us that Jesus' answer shows that he upheld a carefully balanced division of powers and a clear demarcation between the political and religious realms. Hardly. While not denying the secular right to tax, Jesus made it clear that that right is not absolute, for the right to taxation is God's. Taxation therefore should be ordered in the interest of God and his creation. Again, Caesar exists, and he might make a claim to his office from God, but the office itself belonged to God, and the exercise of it had to accord with God's interest. Jesus' remarkable response had left Caesar with little leg to stand on. As Jesus would say to Pilate in his trial, you would have no power if it were not given to you from on high. The angelic praises in Revelation remind us that all power belongs to God, and to his plenipotentiary on earth and heaven, Jesus. Through God's dispensation, the political and religious spheres exist, but they cannot always be clearly demarked. Issues will arise where both spheres are obligated to uphold the interest and authority of God for society and the world, and this sometimes will lead to tension and even opposition. As Christians we exist in both spheres, but we must always remember that our first allegiance is to love God and our neighbour. Christians who over domesticate the faith, have forgotten that truth is not conditioned by what is private or public on the one hand, or what is conveniently defined as political or religious, on the other. When Jesus said my kingdom is not of this world, he meant that his kingdom does not originate from the values of this fallen world, not that we shouldn't seek to see those values worked out in the world. Otherwise why should his incarnation make manifest what is hidden and why did he teach us to pray, that God's kingdom should come upon earth as it is heaven? Fr Julian


**EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT** will not take place on **Friday evening.**
