

Gospel: Matthew 22: 34-40

You must love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself.

Our collect today is a prayer that God would 'make us love what you command'. If God makes us love, is that truly love? Can love be genuine, if forced? Doesn't love have to be freely given? Isn't this the principle at the heart of our relationship with God, where love is freely entered into? We see this in the covenant of Christian marriage. Couples enter into it with free consent and without constraint. So, what does the collect mean? The collect talks of a love already established within covenantal relationship, not those entering upon it, such as approaching holy matrimony or becoming baptised. As members of the Church we renew our covenantal relationship each time we freely participate in holy communion. As we are so often people of little faith, hope and charity, it is only fitting that we ask God for more of them. Through them, it is God, not us, who 'makes' us love his commands. Just like water (which we didn't create)



saturates the ground and produces growth (which we cannot determine) so God's grace activates these gifts. God's activity is not contrary to our freedom, for the Church teaches us that we express our greatest freedom in willing what God wants and bringing ourselves into alignment with his commands. And what does God command? In the gospel today, Jesus answers that very question, posed by his opponents, 'what is the greatest commandment of the law'? Jesus says that we must first, 'love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind' and second, we 'must love your neighbour as yourself'. In fact, Jesus said that the second commandment resembles the first. How is this? If we love God then it will mean that we love what God loves, and will what he wills, which is the good of the other. To love our neighbour as ourselves therefore is to will for them the same love that God has for us. But divine love goes further than willing for others what we will for ourselves. If our love for our neighbour resembles our love for God, and his love for us, then that love has to involve the gift of our very selves as well. God wants us to freely give ourselves to Him and to the other. This is at the heart of what the communion of the mass is all about. Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, and therefore we ought to give up ourselves for one another. Those who absent themselves from receiving holy communion show that they have not entered into love. If we truly love our brothers and sisters in the faith, then we will want to share the free gift of ourselves with them and Our Lord. The same truth undergirds the sacrament of marriage, which is why it is likened to the relationship between Christ and his Church. Where one of the couples has not given themselves to the other, then their marriage is insecure for true love has to go beyond simply willing the good of the other. We discover ourselves through love, for as Gaudium et Spes said, 'Man, who is the only creature on earth which God willed for itself, cannot fully find himself except through a sincere gift of himself'. Or to explain God's intention, as Julian of Norwich put it: 'Know it well, love was his meaning. Who reveals it to you? Love. What did he reveal to you? Love. Why does he reveal it to you? For love. Remain in this, and you will know more of the same. But you will never know different, without end. So, I was taught that love is our Lord's meaning. And I saw very certainly in this and in everything that before God made us he loved us, which love was never abated and never will be. And in this love, he has done all his works, and in this love, he has made all things profitable to us, and in this love our life is everlasting. In our creation we had beginning, but the love in which he created us was in him from without beginning. In this love we have our beginning, and all this shall we see in God without end. Thanks be to God'. Fr Julian
