

Gospel: Matthew 25: 1-13

The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him.

Recently I went on a priests' retreat, organised by the well-established World-Wide Marriage Encounter (WWME) programme, which since its founding in 1960s has helped millions of couples to unlock the power of their relationships. It exists in over 90 countries. The retreat allowed priests to see Marriage Encounter from the inside, and to show them, through relationship formation, how they might develop their own personal interactions, not least with the wider church family. In fact, from its inception, the programme always has always had a priest alongside the presenting couple as one of the facilitators. Central to the vision of WWME is the shared journeying into wholeness. Many couples are ill equipped to meet the



problems they encounter and have never explored what causes differences between them, and how these can be negotiated and bridged. When our closest relationships are taken for granted, caused or compounded by the complexities of everyday life, unconscious habits can get ingrained. These often prevent the necessary intimacy needed for relationships to grow and mature. Even when a marriage is going smoothly, there is always room to make it work better. Just as our homes and gadgets need constant maintenance and attention to ward against difficulties in the future, so too do our closest relationships. Marriage Encounter draws from the experience of many couples. It explores the crucial areas of different personality styles; how we appreciate our differences; how we can develop our facility of listening and how we can communicate more intimately. Difficult topics are addressed, not skirted, and couples are resourced for the ongoing journey beyond the programme. Though open to all, it is an unashamedly catholic course as its teaching is informed by a catholic sacramental understanding of marriage. Marriage is seen as God's intention and blessing not just for the couples but for the Church and world as well. Communication is central to being engaged, married, and indeed all relationship. One wonders from the parable today whether the bride ever shared her choice of bridesmaids with the groom, as it is apparent from the way that the bridegroom responds that he didn't know some of them! Of course, the reason why some of the bridesmaids were barred from the wedding hall was less for some skulduggery on the part of the bride, than that they were ill-quipped. It was the duty of the bridesmaids to await the return of the bridegroom. Five of them had the resources for the long wait, five did not. They ran out of oil. In the end it was not their status as bridesmaids which was important but whether or not they were able to fulfil what was expected of them and had the necessary weight to do so. Jesus presents it as a picture of all of us who bear his name. The label we carry is less important than whether or not we are credible witnesses of his grace and mercy. Are we a sponsor, godparent, baptised, married? Are we authentic? Sacramental initiation is not enough. We need to be evangelised as well as sacramentalised. Do we have the desire to deepen our relationship with Christ? Are we regularly communicating and sharing in a depth of communion that will sustain our relationship? It's at the heart of all authentic marriage. Couples on the WWME programme have to ask the same question. There can be few words as chilling in scripture, or in any relationship, as 'I do not know you'. As I look back at the retreat, the overriding impression is that here is a programme centred on developing understanding, communication and love. These are values desperately needed in our world today. How many wars have started without them? As Remembrance Day looms, let us remember all those couples whose relationships were shattered by war, and those who lost their young lives before they were able to enjoy the blessings of married life. 
