

YR A 33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 19TH NOVEMBER 2023

Gospel: *Matthew* 25: 14-30

You have been faithful in small things; come and join in your master's happiness.

We are created for God. If we place our hopes in other human beings or created things we will never find contentment, because we were never created for them. There is deep down within us a well which can only be filled by God. Try as much as we like to fill it with other things, in the end we will remain unfulfilled, and dissatisfied. Serving God, seeking to love him, entering into relationship with him, these bring satisfaction. That doesn't mean that we despise created things or cut ourselves off from normal human relationships, but it does mean that we welcome them, not to possess, but to graciously receive, as gifts through which we can bring



glory to God. All that God has made is good. In the words of this morning's collect, He is 'the author of all that is good'. He knows what is in our best interest. The collect invites us to pray for 'the constant gladness of being devoted to you, for it is full and lasting happiness to serve with constancy'. Whatever our vocation in life, its landscape belongs to God, and we can meet him there. The place we inhabit becomes holy ground if we remember that it is not just in the 'holy' things that we are called to worship. We turn out for mass out of love for Jesus who asks us to do so 'in remembrance of him'. But as the proper preface in the mass continually reminds us, 'it is truly right and just, our duty and salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Father most holy'. Always and everywhere? That word 'thanks' has the same root as the word eucharist. Our daily work becomes an eucharistic offering in as much as we give God thanks through it, wherever that may be. 'Seven whole days, not one in seven, I will praise you', shouts George Herbert. As God is our creator, he is the source of all creative impulses and ingenuity. He knows our work better than ourselves. If we make it an offering to him, we should expect to be blessed. The prayer over the offerings today, asks that 'what we offer in the sight of your Majesty may obtain for us the grace of being devoted to you and gain the prize of everlasting happiness'. The words are specifically referring to the bread and the wine about to be consecrated, but it is placed within the context of our daily offering of the fruit of the earth and the labour of our hands. The psalmist today says, 'O blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways! By the labour of your hands you shall eat. You will be happy and prosper.' It is an aspect of God's graciousness and humility that He calls us to work with him in his ongoing work of creativity. In today's parable of the talents, the master enables his workers to respond freely and creatively to his invitation to carry on his work. Not only does he entrust his property to them, he gives them capital to further his property portfolio, proportionate to their respective abilities. He is equally pleased by his two servants who made more than what he gave them. We might expect him to be more pleased with the one who made more investments than the other. Not at all. Both receive the reply, 'Well done, good and faithful servant, you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater'. In relative terms what the master has asked of his servants may be insignificant (he calls it 'small things') yet their willing response had consequences beyond their imagination. As a result, they were able to join their master in his happiness. Jesus wants us to ponder, how much more happiness awaits those who invest in the things of God. Who would be foolish enough to ignore God's gracious gifts, bury them in the ground and reject divine investment...the only investment guaranteed to survive and increase. Fr Julian.
