


YEAR A CHRIST THE UNIVERSAL KING

26TH NOVEMBER 2023

Gospel: Matthew 25: 31-46

He will take his seat on his throne of glory, and he will separate men one from another.

Human history is littered with examples of counterfeit kingdoms of God, the result of many failed human experiments and ideologies. The true kingdom of God comes from heaven not from man, and its vision has always been an inspiration. Yet the tide of secularism has eroded the kingdom values which previously undergirded so called 'Christendom'. This momentum will increase in end-times, as St Paul tells us today: 'After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death'. If sovereignty, authority and power are not sourced in God they are at odds with heaven. Human beings, like the governing



principles of the world, are at variance with God. There is within each and every one of us a battle for supremacy. Who holds sway? Who is sovereign? Who has power over us? Who really has authority in our lives? Christians are not immune from this struggle. We are inevitably compromised by living within the world and we have to negotiate how best to be good citizens. However, our ultimate allegiance is not the state but elsewhere, as our entrance antiphon from the Apocalypse proclaims: 'How worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity, and wisdom and strength and honour. To him belong glory and power for ever and ever'. Today we acknowledge Christ as the universal and cosmic King. He is the object and fount of all worship and service. Our collect prays that 'the whole creation, set free from slavery, may render your majesty service'. What Jesus says today radically challenges our notion both of service and sovereignty. He invests service with a royalty which the world denies it. At the same time, he shows that true kingship is an identification with those who have not. He presents us with the demands of six of the seven corporeal acts of mercy. Feeding the hungry, giving water to the thirsty, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, comforting the sick, and visiting the imprisoned. (Burying the dead, highlighted in the book of Tobit, was added to form the seventh corporeal act during the Middle Ages). The peoples of the world-the nations- will be judged, Jesus says, according to how they have treated him in 'the least of his brothers' by carrying out these corporeal acts. Even when on mission, the way in which the disciples were welcomed, had invited judgement. Though we be disciples, necessarily this judgment falls on us as well. What of our own acts of corporeal mercy? Have we perceived our fellow brothers and sisters in need? Nor must we limit the gospel by seeking to help those only like ourselves. Doesn't Jesus identify himself with the whole of humanity? Isn't this what his incarnation, sacrificial life and death, is all about? If neighbourliness is defined by showing grace and mercy, how much more brotherhood? Those praised in the parable for inadvertently meeting the needs of the disciples, simply saw the need and met it. Let's pray that as we carry out our own corporeal acts of mercy we are not too scrupulous and sparing. If we are, then how are we any different from the 'nations' who rejected the gospel of grace and mercy? Fr Julian.

FINANCIAL RESULTS FOR 2022 are now available to view on the insert in the newsletter. During 2022, we did not cover our daily running costs and had an average deficit of £663 per week. Even though our total offertory has gone up by 24.4% over the last 3 years, the average weekly donation per person was £3.67. If you are in a position to give more, it would make a real difference. Just 32% of our total offertory and donations were gift aided. If everyone had giftaided their donations, we would have received an extra £26,036 this year! If you pay tax, please do sign up for Gift Aid so that we can add 25% to everything that you give, at no cost to yourself.
