

YEAR B THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

17TH DECEMBER 2023

Gospel: John 1:6-8, 19-28

There stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me.

Advent is a time of reflection, hope and repentance, but today reminds us, it is also a time of joy. 'Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice. Indeed the Lord is near' proclaims our entrance antiphon. Today is called Gaudete Sunday ('Rejoice' Sunday), and we even have a different liturgical colour to underline the fact. We rejoice as we await Jesus' return, while already experiencing the joy of his living presence among us. It was for this joy that Isaiah prophesied



of the Messiah's coming in our first reading: 'I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God, for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation'. Our psalm is Mary's song of joy on knowing that she carries the Lord in her womb: 'My soul glorifies the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God, my Saviour'. The same joy is seen in the two extracts from St Paul's letters. The first (the entrance antiphon) is from his letter to the Philippians, 'Rejoice in the Lord always'. The second (our epistle reading) is from his first letter to the Thessalonians, and starts with the words, 'Be happy'. Most translations however, including our own Douai, render it, 'Always rejoice'. Why did Paul have to tell the Christians of his day to 'always rejoice', or similarly, 'rejoice in the Lord always'? Might he have the same message for us today? Do we need to be told to rejoice because it is all too easy for us Christians not to? Zipped lips have no place in heaven. Yet isn't it a feigned joy if it comes from being told that we have to rejoice? After all, joy is gift of the Spirit and like all spiritual gifts it wells up from within. Water reaches the surface. It bubbles or bursts out wherever it finds an opening. There is little you can do to stop it. You can try to channel it, but it comes out nevertheless. Isn't joy the same? It isn't forced. It just appears. I think of the springs of water at home on the farm in Mid-Wales. Long before it reaches the surface, spring water travels quite a distance and remains unseen. Just like spring water, joy can be under the surface for quite a while before it emerges into the light. Even when someone is going through the deepest difficulty or loss, joy can be there, not necessarily revealed on the facial surface, but deeper down, because that person knows that come what may, nothing can shake the rock-solid foundation of their faith in God's love. Jesus himself experienced the same joy, even as he went to the death. The letter to the Hebrews says, 'For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame'. We can know the same joy whenever we know we are doing God's will, come what may. This doesn't mean that we have no part to play in accessing joy. Jesus himself had to align himself with God's perfect will for the salvation of the world. Joy has to be willed in us also. It is much more than a passing experience, dependent upon our moods and circumstances, which is how most people understand joy. The temptation is for us Christians to think the same. When Jesus said 'Well done, good and faithful servant. Enter into the joy of your Lord', such joy had to be accessed by entering upon it, just as we would need to enter across a threshold. This is a joy which is an act of will even before an experience. Most people understand joy as coming from the things which they desire or like, which gives them a sense of contentment, regardless of the source and end of the desire. True joy is aligning ourselves with God's will, more than an emotional high. A pleasurable experience may be good or bad, and invariably fleeting, if it is not sourced in God our Creator, but elsewhere, including the volatility of our temperaments. The advertising con artists tell us the more you accumulate the greater the joy. This can never be true Christian joy. Deprivation is not its enemy. In this season of unrestrained consumerism, how about cultivating some simplicity, and seeking out where true joy can be found. John the Baptist found it in the one whose sandal-straps he was not fit to undo. How about you and me? Fr Julian.
