

# 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT/CHRISTMAS 24<sup>TH</sup>/25<sup>TH</sup> DEC 2023

Gospel: *Luke* 1: 26-38

Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son.

We are wired to be social creatures. Neuroscientists say that our brains function only as we interact with others. Our health and emotional wellbeing depend upon it. While we can communicate across distances as never before, are we really communicating? Communication is not just about hearing or seeing flat images. We are told that the greatest communication takes place as we interact face to face, since body language communicate, much less from the tone of our voice, and even less by the words themselves. As far as communication is concerned, digitalisation has brought immense benefits to humanity but its downside is a dehumanisation. In his post-synodal exhortation,



Christus Vivit, Pope Francis, warns that 'It is not healthy to confuse communication with mere virtual contact'. The digital environment he says can block 'the development of authentic interpersonal relationships' and lead to 'a gradual loss of contact with concrete reality'. An environment of remoteness, 'creates a delusional parallel reality that ignores human dignity" and invites a "digital migration" into a lonely world of rootlessness and "self-invention." If virtual contact is not to be confused with authentic communication, neither is the wall of recorded messages greeting you on the phone. It is so irritating to be addressed by a machine offering innumerable options unrelated to the simple question you want answered. The world of work has altered, not always for the better. Where automation deprives people of work, it denigrates their human dignity and is socially and psychologically destructive. In our streets we find the level of human engagement daily decreasing. Banks have disappeared. Postal services are not delivering. Most large shops seem to be short staffed. Even our hospitals are losing the human interface. The other day, not finding a patient on the ward where I was expecting him, I was at a loss trying to find him, once I found that the reception desk and visitors' portal were closed. Where have the 'human' beings gone? What has all this to do with Christmas you are probably thinking? Everything in fact. In our first reading today, King David wants to build a house for God, only to be told that God will build him a house, but a house, not made of bricks and mortar but of fully sentient human beings in covenantal relationship with their Creator, just like the previous covenants with Noah, Abraham and Moses. In our gospel reading, the angel Gabriel informs Mary, that in spite of her virginity she will conceive a son because the 'Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will overshow you'. This language was used only of the Temple, yet here it is used of a young woman. This 'overshadowing' of Mary is the same word used of the overshowing the tabernacle, where the Jews believed that God above all resided. What was once applied to the Holy of Holies is now applied to a human being. Mary's human womb becomes the very receptacle for the presence of God, just as the ark of the covenant had been before. God himself would reside in human flesh, 'pleased as man with men to dwell' as Charles Wesley puts it. Yet this was no rent a womb, surrogate affair. God Emmanuel would evolve in Mary's womb, like us in our mother's womb, from pin-prick ovum to full natal birth. Why? The children of the flesh had to be saved in the flesh. Sin-the enemy of humanity- could only be vanquished in humanity, not by us but only by his body and blood. Not the least of our sins, from which the Saviour came to save us, is the sin of inhumanity; our dehumanising of one another as if we are not made in God's image. Accepting the gift of Christmas means welcoming Christ into our lives. It is the incomparable gift of becoming more human; the prospect of a being, becoming fully alive and human in the fullest sense, as God always wanted us to be, in relationship with him as his sons and daughters. Celebrate the Saviour's birth. Happy Christmas! Will the human being self-identify please? Fr Julian.
