

YEAR B HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY & JOSEPH 31ST DECEMBER 2023

Gospel: *Luke* 2: 22-40

The child grew, filled with wisdom.

Today we remember the Holy Family. On occasions, as in today's gospel, we see them as a nuclear family, just Mary, Joseph and Jesus. On other occasions, scripture reveals a much wider family, cousins like Elizabeth and Zechariah, and those relatives who were among Jesus' eventual wider group of disciples. Most of us have a nuclear and extended family. The extended family is more evident in rural societies because people tend to be part of a more established network. I grew up on a hill farm in Breconshire. My two best friends growing up were a second and a third cousin who lived locally. In Wales, as elsewhere, before greater mechanisation, the ties of the extended family were strong, and this was reinforced by events like shearing or harvest where extra hands were needed. In Jesus' day, pilgrimage was one of the activities which drew an extended family together, which is why Mary and Joseph readily assumed that Jesus



was safely among relatives when they went up to Jerusalem for Passover when he was twelve years old. In today's gospel we have the story of Joseph and Mary taking Jesus up to Jerusalem on his first visit, not for Passover, but for his presentation. All the first born according to the law belonged to God, and should be offered to him. However, the tradition had arisen of buying back or 'redeeming' the first born from the Lord and offering a sacrifice instead. Mary offers a pair of turtledoves, a sign of poverty, as she is unable to offer the sacrifice of the wealthy. This was the occasion when first Simeon and then Anna approached the holy couple. We don't know anything about Simeon's family background, but Anna had at onetime been married. Now she was widowed. With time on her hands, she had spent much of it serving God, in her case, fasting and praying in the Temple. Taking Jesus in his arms, before Simeon blessed the couple, he blessed God for sending the one who is...'a light to lighten the gentiles and the glory of your people Israel'. Here is a vision of a much wider family, the family of all nations. God chose a family, the people of Israel, not because they were better than any other people but simply because God chose them. They were to reveal his loving purposes to all the nations, and now Jesus, a Jew, comes as the apex of the Jewish witness. But whereas Israel had failed, Jesus the Son (Israel's glory) would take God's light to the gentiles, and accomplish and complete the Father's mission. The family of nations would hear the good news of the Saviour's birth, and, through the Church, be grafted into the chosen people of God and receive the same blessings as them. Thus, Abraham becomes the father not of one but many nations, as numerous, our second reading says, 'as the stars of heaven or the grains of sand on the sea'. Christ enables us to share the faith of Abraham, which made him right in God's eyes, and access through his new covenant the benefits of the old. It is through Christ that nations and families are united. Only through his reconciling love can hatred be turned to love. But this would not come about without turmoil and upheaval. The holy family must have questioned what blessing Simeon was giving them. Mary hears that her son will be rejected, but that he will cause many to rise and fall. Her own soul would be pierced to its core as if by a sword. With what trepidation they must have left the Temple. Many families can identify with them, especially those caught in the crossfire of life. The holy family reminds us also that dysfunctionality need not be a barrier to holiness. Joseph was not Jesus' biological father, but like many fathers or mothers he faithfully provided the protection that the family needed. In his loving care, he practiced what we are all called to practice (whether as members of a natural family or members of the family of the Church), what our collect today calls...... 'the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity'. Fr Julian.


