

# SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

# 14<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2024

Today is the second Sunday in Ordinary Time so called, although it happens also to be the second Sunday after Christmas. The crib figures are still out. The three wise men have not yet returned to their package holiday in the sacristy. These star gazers continually prompt us to look upwards into the night skies and to ponder the glory of the universe. Possibly they never conceived of the idea of interplanetary travel. Traversing the deserts was enough for them. Even a few generations back, people would have been disbelieving to hear of journeys to the moon and back. Now, five decades Gospel: John 1: 35-42 Come and see.



after the Apollo landings, we might soon have Artemis landings. When I was growing up I was fascinated by the night sky, spurred on by the sensation of the first moon landings. However, one of my teachers invited me to look more closely through the telescope. She shared how her elderly father had greeted the news of the Apollo expedition...man has been sent to the moon, but what kind of man are we sending there? You don't need me to tell you that at the start of this new year, humanity is in a bit of a mess. We are all heading for a rough ride ahead if we fail to resolve the fundamental problem of our alienation from God and from one another, regardless of the new year resolutions we keep or break. As Jeremiah reminds us 'the human heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick'. Our human arterial disease means that ascendancy often ends up in descendancy. Where 'progress' has been hailed, so often, one giant step for mankind turns out to be three steps backward, and as we have learnt to our universal cost, one giant disaster for the rest of creation. Is it not because we have lost perspective of our true place in the created order of things, lost any notion of what really makes us human, lost any reverence for God and his desire for us to live in relationship with him? In his gospel prologue, St John the Evangelist doesn't talk of a journey from earth to the moon, but a journey from heaven into humanity. This journey is the greatest travel narrative, and deepest love romance. It is the story of how Christ was conceived and born as one of us, so that through him, we would be married to heaven and live the life of eternity. Believing Jesus...(repenting of our sins and accepting his truth)... and welcoming him into our lives alone resolves our fundamental existential problem. In Jesus, we are no longer cut off from God and from one another, for we are reconciled through his sacrificial death and empowered to live the life of heaven on earth: 'But to all who did accept him, he gave power to become children of God, to all who believe in the name of him who was born not out of human stock, or urge of the flesh or will of man but of God himself'. St John tells us that Jesus, was already in the cosmos into which he was coming, and even more than that, that he is the very Creator of the entire cosmos itself. 'He was coming into the cosmos. He was in the cosmos that had its being through him, and the cosmos did not know him'. The cosmos did not know its Creator! The shocking truth of our Christian faith is that our Creator can be known personally not just in theory or as a first principle. The good news has always been 'Come and See', as Jesus said in today's gospel to those who were drawing closer. 'Come and see' at the start of this new year. Be drawn, like the first disciples into the love of Jesus. Know the pull of his cosmic love. Open our eyes to His universe. He will never disappoint. Everything else will. Fr Julian

SPUC WHITE FLOWER APPEAL: The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) will be holding its annual appeal **this weekend**. SPUC's vision is for

As well as ending the lives of precious babies, this policy lacks safeguards against illegal late-term abortions, and puts mothers at physical and psychological risk. 86% of GPs are concerned that the scheme leaves women vulnerable to coerced abortion.
