

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

7TH JANUARY 2024

Gospel: Matthew 2: 1-12

We saw his star and have come to do the king homage.

The story of the Magi has a profound contemporary relevance and challenges us on a variety of fronts. First, let's consider their effort to get to Bethlehem. We do not know exactly where they came from, though they most likely came from the area of the Persian Gulf. They faced a long and tiring journey. Imagine the fore-planning and thought that had gone into it. Now contrast this to our situation where we have fallen into the practice of not turning up on time, even though we live relatively near-by. How much preparation and effort has gone into our coming to what is the summit of our worship together? Today St Paul talks of



us as 'parts of the same body', which means that for the majority of us who are able, worship entails worshipping together not in isolation. It may be more comfortable watching mass on the box, but this hardly gives substance to the communion and charity which is at the heart of what it means to come together. Do we allow too easily less important things to encroach upon what should be the most important thing we are called to do each week? Who is calling the sho ts in our life? Jesus or the gods of the world? The effort of the Magi reminds me of the struggles which impoverished Christians in the so-called developing world face, when, in order to get to Church each week, they have to walk miles. They put me to shame. The second thing that strikes us about the Magi is how much they teach me about faith. They were prepared to step out, not knowing the whole picture. In comparison, how reassured do I need to be, before I believe or volunteer anything? Faith cannot be faith without an element of trust in the face of the unknown. Yet it is not the unknown because we trust also in the experience of others. They sought advice, aware that they needed help for the right direction. Their greatest help came from the Word of God. Astronomy could take them only so far. It will be the same for us. Let us never be so proud to think that we have no need of accompaniment or that God has finished with us. The third thing to note about the Magi is that their worship was truly costly. It involved a sacrifice, and a sacrifice, much more than being away from home, family and pursuits. They came bearing gifts for the new born king. Is our sacrifice of praise and worship truly sacrificial, earthed in humility? Have we like them, surrendered ourselves before Jesus in total humble adoration? Do we recognise that we are nothing without him, that all that we have, things both natural and spiritual come from above? What we make of our gifts and graces is up to ourselves but we would be wise to surrender all into God's hands. When we do this, God magnifies them with greater dividends for his kingdom and a greater blessing for ourselves and others. Even the Magi had to surrender their great wisdom to the greater wisdom of heaven. They surrendered their gifts also. These were costly, and an act of love. My offering is not an act of love when others are carrying a financial burden which I should be helping to carry, or when I withhold help when it is needed and I am able. When did I offer Jesus something which wasn't second best or the left overs? What god is draining my expenses and life? The fourth thing that strikes us is that they were outsiders. Why did God choose outsiders to be the first to welcome the new born king? Is it that they would more readily welcome and worship him than those on the inside? At what point do interested seekers become no longer outsiders but actually more insiders than many who think they are? God's ways are unfathomable, and He will use the most unlikely means to draw the most unlikely people into faith. Let us not hide behind barricades and assume that we are saved by denominationalism, because we are not. That is playing politics with the gospel of Christ. Shun Herod's ways. Become a wise man. Let us return to the poor manger, to the One whom our antiphon today proclaims as the Mighty One, holding all power, kingship and dominion. Fr Julian.

EPIPHANY: It is traditional to chalk the lintel of your house at Epiphany like this, 20+C+M+B+24. The year is obvious, the crosses refer to Calvary and C, M, B stand for the traditional names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar, or alternatively for the Latin blessing *Christus mansionem benedicat* ('May Christ bless this house'),
