

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

11TH FEBRUARY 2024

Gospel: *Mark* 1: 40-45

The leprosy left him at once and he was cured.

This week sees Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent, when anyone who wishes, may receive the ash upon their foreheads as a sign of penance. We will hear again the familiar words: 'Repent and believe in the gospel' or 'Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return'. These wonderfully liberating and enabling words remind me of my personal responsibility, that I have total freedom to respond and welcome the good news, through a change of mind, heart and direction, and that I should believe rather than disbelieve. They remind me also that I am on the terra firma of my Creator's designs. Falling into His hands, and coming to terms with my own mortality, is the first step of giving the immortal God glory. Both of these passages are taken from holy scripture. The first is the clarion



call of the gospel: Jesus' proclamation of the good news at the start of his mission. The second is taken from the story of Adam and Eve in Genesis, which reminds us that, though we receive creative life through the non-created breath of God, we are fashioned out of the very matter of the creation. Adam whose name means earth belonged to the earth before he belonged to heaven. Our representative parents rebelled against God, and the consequences of this rebellion are still with us. The fall of humanity-our alienation from God and one another-necessitated the sending of the second Adam, to reverse the sin of the first, so that we could be restored to the Eden of God's favour. And so Lent starts with this refreshing reminder that I need to be re-created in the name of Jesus the second Adam. Only through self-denial, renunciation and repentance can I enter upon the road to restoration. This is a path which self-congratulatory, self-inflated, self-obsessed humanity needs to walk in every generation. It is a universal proclamation of good news, perennially relevant to all peoples, but perhaps most of all to modern man. People today have chosen to deny their Creator, to go it alone. The consequences are all around us. Atomized living, narcissism, the breakdown of family and society, disrespect for law and order and the dignity of human life. Left to our own devices, we worship our own idols fashioned by our exploitative, unjust and immoral hands. Deciding that we can do without God, our state is more desperate than that of our first ancestors. How much we need to fall on our knees, repent, seek forgiveness for the disasters we have wrought on the world. If the leper in today's gospel could come to Jesus and fall on his knees before him, seeking cleansing for his condition, why do we find it so difficult? Is it because we are so clean and have no need of divine grace? Biblical leprosy was not the same as modern leprosy which is Hansen's disease. Regrettably, those who suffer from the latter have been associated with its stigma. As we see our Leviticus reading that stigma was one of uncleanliness. There were good medical reasons why those suffering from contagious skin disease should go into isolation away from others, 'outside the camp' as Moses said. Biblical leprosy was contagious and contaminates, in a way that Hansen's disease is and does not. It is easy to see how leprosy became a metaphor for the ills of society, a society in need of cleansing and restoration. But why despair? The deep clean company is at hand, and a date fixed for the scheduled work to begin. Just give your agreement. No signature needed, just a desire to turn back from self-destruction and to remind yourself and others who calls the shots in your life. Don't run with the crowd. Don't be politically correct. Receive the penitential sign of the Cross in ash, and let the fruits of repentance grow. Fr Julian

LENT

ASH WEDNESDAY is on 14th February and Mass will be at 9.15am with St Cross School, 2pm with St Augustine's School and 8pm. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting (for those aged 16-60) and



abstinence (for those aged 14+). This means that we consciously choose to eat less – one main meal only – and that (as on all Fridays) we avoid meat.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be prayed in church each Friday (12.30pm after Mass) and Saturday (9.30am before Mass.) Exposition of the blessed Sacrament will take place at 9am on Saturday mornings in Lent.

EXTRA CONFESSIONS IN LENT: Fr Julian will be available to hear confessions on Fridays in Lent during Exposition 6-7pm.
