

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

18TH FEBRUARY 2024

Gospel: *Mark* 1: 12-15

Jesus was tempted by Satan, and the angels looked after him.

Following his baptism, Jesus underwent what we know as the temptation in the wilderness. It became the training ground for his future ministry and mission. We will never understand the three temptations unless we see them in the light of the history of the chosen people. Here, as in other cases, our faith is informed by the experience and landscape of the Jewish past. After the Jews escaped from Egypt, they entered into the wilderness. Their journey revealed three things in particular. They did not trust God's word. They put God to the test. They worshiped an idol instead of the living God. Israel was God's favoured offspring, yet in the wilderness they spurned their Father's love. Now we can see the relevance of Jesus' temptations. In his first temptation, he is hungry, like Israel.



However, unlike them, he trusts God's word for his provision, citing the scripture: 'Man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God'. In the second temptation, when Satan tempts him to throw himself off the high point of the Temple, he refuses to test God: 'You must not put God to the test'. In contrast, Israel had shown their disloyalty by putting God to the test at the waters of Meribah. The climax of Israel's rebellion was their worship of the golden calf, crafted by their own hands. They rejected the worship of the God who loved them and who had freed them from slavery. This explains why Jesus' third temptation was one of idolatry, to worship, not a golden calf, but Satan himself. Satan had taken Jesus to a high mountain, from where he could see all the kingdoms of the world. 'I will give you all these' Satan said 'if you fall at my feet and worship me', to which Jesus replied, 'You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone'. In his three temptations, Jesus succeeded where Israel failed. Consequently, the place of rebellion-the wilderness- becomes the place of victory. Though Jesus' temptations parallel those of Israel, in scale and magnitude they were so much more. In them Jesus not only redresses the failure of Israel by his obedience to the Father's will, but also undergoes temptation for all peoples. We all have an interest in the wilderness. His refusal to succumb opened the way towards the life-giving cross. There would be skirmishes with Satan throughout Jesus' ministry, and Satan would return with force to try to tempt Jesus from going to Calvary. Through Jesus' supreme act of obedience by sacrificing his life for our salvation, he would finally defeat Satan. While Jesus underwent the temptations for us, this does not mean that we will not be tempted. While we will not undergo what Jesus underwent, we will be tempted along similar lines...not to trust God's word, to put God to the test and to worship anything and everything except the living God who made them. We rejoice in Jesus' victory but also in showing us how best to protect ourselves...through trusting God's word, through knowing His presence (so that we don't need to put Him to the test), and by rejecting any idolatry. In our spiritual combat, let us know also the protection of the armoury of the Spirit, the sacraments of grace, and our disciplines of prayer, almsgiving and fasting. In communion as well, we have Our Lady and the whole host of Heaven ministering and interceding for us. And don't forget, Satan is a liar and deceiver. Why have we fallen for his lie that the world belongs to him? It doesn't, not do we...unless of course we are not true to our baptism promises.... to reject Satan, and all his works and all his empty show. If we are not, then we are fair game. We have been warned. Fr Julian
