



SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

25TH FEBRUARY 2024

Gospel: *Mark 9: 2-10 This is my Son, the Beloved.*

As we journey through Lent, it is important not to lose sight of the glory that awaits us. Our gospel today, the story of the Transfiguration, is real food for the journey, not least because it takes place on the real-life journey that Jesus himself was making towards Jerusalem-his Exodus, as Luke describes it, likening it to the journey of the people of Israel towards freedom. Jesus had taken three of his disciples up a high mountain, believed to be Mount Tabor, where he was transfigured before them. As the disciples looked back, they must have been greatly strengthened by this amazing experience. St Peter in fact recounts it in one of his letters.



For them the transfiguration comes like a bolt out of the blue. It brought them face to face with the supernatural power of God. It opened to them an entirely different dimension to reality than what they had experienced before. Above all they saw Jesus in an entirely different light. They had witnessed miraculous healings and events but this was of a different order. The miracle this time happened in and through Jesus' own person. Jesus' body was shown to emit such a blinding light that his 'clothes became dazzling white, whiter than any earthly bleach could make'. The Transfiguration must have blown their concept of space and time. It was as if they momentary glimpsed heaven whilst still on earth. They saw with their eyes Moses and Elijah, the representatives of the law and the prophets speaking to Jesus. Those whom they had presumed dead-many hundreds of years before- were actually alive, and, not as disembodied souls but identifiably their very persons. Moreover, this was even before the final resurrection of the dead, which most Jews expected at the end of time. If this were not enough, they heard audibly, that which had been presumed to be silent since the end of the days of prophecy-the very voice of God telling them to listen to God's beloved Son. Above all the Transfiguration revealed to them the divine and personal credentials of Jesus. At the time they understood nothing of this. It would only be after Jesus' Resurrection that they could begin to understand it, which is why Jesus told them not to share with anyone what they had seen until after he had risen from the dead. It would only make sense then, when it would help to explain his victory over death and why he was raised from the dead. In this time of inward and outward journeying, when we follow our own path of discipleship, the Transfiguration is a great encouragement to us also. It invites us to look beyond the circumstances of Jesus' death and resurrection, towards his ascension and eventual glorification. His glorious light intimates to us the glory which Jesus had before the beginning of the world, and which his obedient death would restore to him. We are inevitably drawn into worship, to fall down before Him, just as the disciples did. One of them, John, in his gospel would unwrap for us the theology behind it. Christ is the uncreated Light that enlightens everyone, whom the darkness cannot overcome, the eternal logos and Second Person of the Trinity. It invites us also to ponder our own destiny in Christ, that if we lead cross-shaped lives of repentance and share his suffering for a suffering world, we will ourselves be glorified with him. Our paramount duty is to listen. Pope Benedict wrote that while we are on earth, 'our relationship with God takes place more by listening than by seeing...and so, this is the gift and duty for each one of us during the season of Lent: to listen to Christ.... To listen to him in his Word....in the events of our lives, seeking to decipher in them the messages of Providence...to listen to him in our brothers and sisters, especially in the lowly and poor, for whom Jesus himself demands our concrete love'. 'This is my Son, the Beloved, Listen to him'. Fr Julian
