

Gospel: *John 3: 14-21*

God sent his Son so that through him the world might be saved.

The bible tells us that we have been wonderfully and fearfully made. God has created us in his own image, which means that he has given us an ability to create also. All the wonderful creations of human minds take their blueprint from the created world. Yet our human creativity is a pale imitation of the Creator's work. A work of art may be convincing but it is ultimately flat and lifeless in comparison to the real thing. If someone depicted us, it wouldn't be us in the fully fleshed, animated sense. We can't have a meaningful conversation with a photograph or an avatar. God does much more than depict us, he brings into being fully animated human beings. We are created to be like him, to enter into the fulness of God given life. The problem is that so often, instead of acknowledging the source of our creativity, we think that we are the creators and turn the order of creation upside down. God has made us in his own image and we have returned the compliment by making God in our image. With God dethroned, and without amoral compass, our free



will becomes enslaved, resulting in the destruction of God's creation. Our Old Testament reading shows how the 'infidelity upon infidelity' of the children of Israel brought destruction down upon their own heads, resulting in their eventual deportation to Babylon and exile. By our sinfulness we have exiled ourselves from God, and are counted as spiritually dead before him. Like the children of Israel, our relationship with God needs restoration. We are desperately in need of someone to help us and God knows it. He provides a way back. 'God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life'. God's gift to those who believe in Jesus Christ is access now (and not just when we die) into the very creative life of heaven. St Paul in today's epistle, puts it like this, 'God loved us with so much love that he was generous with his mercy: when we were dead through our sins, he brought us to life with Christ...and raised us up with him and gave us a place with him in heaven, in Christ Jesus'. If our fallen state means that we were as good as dead, through the living Christ we are brought to new life. Like the bells in one of my former churches, rendered useless by the conflagration of the blitz, we need to be recast. We can't recreate ourselves, but God can, because he created us in the first place. He calls forth a new creation, not dissimilar to the old, but with an entirely different spirit. Whereas we prided ourselves as our own workmanship, our new person is entirely God's work. 'We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live'. The artist is God, and the medium is Jesus. St Paul often extols the visible and invisible creation, yet he reserves its highest accolade to those brought to life in Jesus. We are simply 'God's work of art'. Are we conscious that we are a sublime work of art brought into being in Jesus Christ? It's all his doing. 'It is by grace that you have been saved, through faith; not by anything of your own, but by a gift from God; not by anything that you have done, so that nobody can claim the credit'. Left to our own devices we make more than a mess of the canvas. Even so, we are always in need of some heavenly varnishing, touching up and an occasional makeover. The divine artist sees to the necessary renewal. He is also waiting to install his latest creations. No cosmetic procedures or cryonics required, just a desire for a new heart and a longing to return from exile. Fr Julian
